# President's Message

We are now in finals week so thank you and congratulations for completing another successful semester at Ventura College! When I talk to students they are so excited about what they are learning in class and all the possibilities in their future. They also talk to me about the person they remembered that visited their high school and the counselor they spoke with. Most of all they tell me how proud they are to be a Pirate! I attribute that to the hard work of all employees across the campus.

In last month's newsletter, I reminded you of our college wide theme, Building Community. I highlighted the following four areas that we would focus on this year: guided pathways, safety on campus, increase diversity among employees and expanding the offerings in the Santa Clara River Valley.

**Guided Pathways** -- We are making progress towards our guided pathways goals. We held two guided pathways workshops this semester. Next semester we will continue to work on the first two cardinal points: Simplify the Path and Assist with Entry.

**Safety on Campus** – We are in the final stages of updating the student conduct procedures and communication protocol. This information will be shared widely across campus during the semester. Classroom door locks will be added (see more about this later in the newsletter).

**Increase diversity among employee groups** – VC and the district remains committed to a diverse faculty, staff, and management that is comparable to the current student demographic.

**Expand the educational offering in the Santa Clara River Valley** – In spring 2019, VCEC is starting two new associate degree programs in Arts and Humanities and Social and Behavioral Sciences. This is only the beginning for VCEC. Ultimately, we would like for VCEC to receive center status by reaching 500 FTES.


**Jay Moore, Director:** Earned an MBA as well as a Master of Architecture. Licensed architect and general contractor. On the Pirate ship since 2010.
