Since the 2009-2010 year we have seen a 49% decrease in students served. The reason for the decrease is that the Human Services Agency appears to nolonger embraces Welfare to Work and are refering less people to VCCCD.

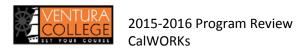

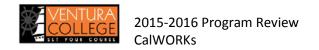
