VENTURA COLLEGE: The 112-acre campus with ocean views is set in the rolling hills of Ventura, conveniently located 60 miles north of Los Angeles and 30 miles south of Santa Barbara. Ventura College is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, an institutional accrediting body recognized by the Council on Post-Secondary Accrediting and the U.S. Department of Education. Ventura College is the home of the **Ventura College Promise**, a grant underwritten by the Ventura College Foundation that pays for the first year at Ventura College for all newly-graduated Ventura County high school seniors or GED recipients, regardless of family income or grade point average.

OUR MISSION: Ventura College, one of the oldest comprehensive community colleges in California, provides a positive and accessible learning environment that is responsive to the needs of a highly diverse student body through a varied selection of disciplines, learning approaches and teaching methods including traditional classroom instruction, distance education, experiential learning, and co-curricular activities.
