I. DISTRICT AND COLLEGE SERVICE AREAS

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A. Overview of the VCCCD

Introduction

The Ventura County Community College District (VCCCD) is a public community college district serving the residents of Ventura County. The VCCCD is comprised of three colleges: Moorpark College, Oxnard College and Ventura College. Each college offers educational programs that (a) lead to AA/AS Degrees and Certificates, (b) provide preparation for transfer to four-year colleges and universities, (c) provide occupational and vocational training, and (d) address basic skills needs. The individual colleges also offer specialty programs/areas that are unique to the particular college. Additionally, colleges are involved in community service and economic development, and providing continuing education for cultural growth, life enrichment, and skills improvement. In fall 2014, at 4th-week census, the VCCCD enrolled 31,830 students.

Colleges

Ventura College is one of the oldest community colleges in California. Higher education in Ventura County began in 1925 when a junior college department was added to the high school in Ventura, and Ventura Junior College was founded shortly after. In 1955, the college moved to its present 112-acre hillside campus in the western part of Ventura. In fall 2014, at fourth-week census, there were 12,989 students enrolled at Ventura College. The Ventura College service area consists of the City of Ventura, the City of Fillmore, the community of Piru, the City of Santa Paula, the City of Ojai, the communities of Mira Monte and Oak View. (See map.)



Moorpark College is the second-oldest and largest of the colleges, located on 150 acres of sloping hillside land in the eastern region of Ventura County. The college has been serving the community since 1967. In fall 2014, at fourth-week census, there were 14,006 students enrolled at Moorpark College.

The Moorpark College service area consists of the City of Newbury Park, the City of Thousand Oaks, the City of Westlake Village, the City of Moorpark, the community of Santa Susana, the City of Simi Valley, and the community of Brandeis.

Oxnard College, founded in 1975, is the newest of the three community colleges in the county. Set on 118 acres and located two miles from Pacific Ocean beaches, the college is easily accessible by the Ventura Freeway or the Pacific Coast Highway. In fall 2014, at fourth-week census, there were 7,108 students enrolled at Oxnard College.

The Oxnard College service area consists of the City of Camarillo, the City of Oxnard, the community of Somis, the City of Port Hueneme, and Naval Base Ventura County (Point Mugu and the Construction Battalion Base at Port Hueneme).





B-2. Ventura County: Population by Gender

Females account for *slightly* over **50%** of Ventura County's population. Population projections from the State of California show the percentage of females in Ventura County holding steady at the current rate of **50.2%** (± **0.1**). The tables below indicate estimated population growth by gender for Ventura County from 2005 to 2050.

At Ventura College, females comprise **55%** of the student body; while nationally, women account for **57%** of post-secondary enrollments. It is expected that future enrollments by females at Ventura College will remain at the current rate (**55%**) or begin to slowly approach the national level (**57%**).





B-3. Ventura County: Population by Race/Ethnicity

Currently, Hispanics account for almost **40%** of Ventura County's population, while Whites represent over **half** (**51%**) of county residents. By 2035, however, it is estimated that the ratio between Hispanics and Whites will reverse: Hispanics will comprise **50%** of county residents and Whites will account for **40%**. The population projections and percentage distributions are shown in the tables below. At Ventura College in **fall 2014**, Hispanics accounted for **57%** of the student body, with Whites representing **31%** of students.

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I. DISTRICT AND COLLEGE SERVICE AREAS

B-4. Ventura County: Population by Age Group

During the next twenty years (2010 - 2030), Ventura County is projected to experience an increase in the percentage of its population who are 35 years of age or older. Although the percentage of county residents in the 18 to 29 age range is projected to decrease by 2.6 percentage points over that period, the actual number of individuals in the 18 to 29 age group is estimated to *increase* by 6,784. Because the majority of students at Ventura College are under 30 years of age (almost 83% in fall 2014), demand for transfer-level classes at VC will probably not diminish over the next twenty years (all other factors being equal). With a projected absolute and percentage growth in county residents who are 65 years of age or older, the college may also find an increase in enrollments in classes of interest to older individuals.

C-1. VC Service Area: Race/Ethnicity by City

As of **April 1, 2010** (2010 U.S. Census), the percentage of Hispanics residing in the Ventura College **service area** was **43%** (see table below). At fourth-week census in **fall 2014**, **57%** of Ventura College students were Hispanic and **31%** were White.



Race Individuals are classified as: Asian, Black, Native American, Pacific Islander, Two or More Races (Multi-Ethnic), Other, or White



Overall, **42.7**% of individuals residing in Ventura College's service area are Hispanic or Latino. The chart below depicts Hispanic/Latino percentages in the areas that are served by Ventura College. At **78**%, the City of Santa Paula has the highest percentage of Hispanic/Latino residents in the VC service area. The Ojai Valley, at **20.9**%, has the lowest Hispanic/Latino percentage of the major political/geographical components of the Ventura College service area.



C-2. VC Service Area: Feeder High Schools

Ninety-one percent (91%) of fall 2014 first-time VC students who graduated high school in 2014 attended a Ventura County high school. In the table below, county high schools are listed according to the number of their 2014 graduates that were first-time students at VC in fall 2014. Since the City of Oxnard borders the City of Ventura to the south, many residents of Oxnard choose to attend Ventura College rather than, or in addition to, Oxnard College.
