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■ BACKGROUND

As part of the college's Program Review and Accreditation processes, the Assessment Office adopted **three Service Unit Outcomes (SUO)** to serve as one measure of their overall effectiveness. These SUOs are paraphrased below.

- 1. Students who take the assessment test will understand how the test results are used.
- 2. Students who take the assessment test will understand the challenge process, should they choose to challenge a prerequisite.
- 3. Students who take the assessment test will understand the role and use of prerequisites.

The **purpose** of this survey is to obtain preliminary data for use by Assessment Office staff in evaluating whether they are on track to meet their SUO goals.

■ SURVEY SPECIFICATIONS

Survey Instrument

The Fall 2012 English Assessment – Student Survey was created by Stephen Manriquez (Matriculation Specialist II) and Michael Callahan (Institutional Research Officer). Survey items were based on questions composed by Steve Manriquez which were then refined by Michael Callahan, who created a draft of the survey instrument in SurveyMonkey. The draft was sent to Victoria Lugo (Dean of Student Services) and Steve Manriquez for their review. After their approval of the survey, Michael Callahan wrote a draft of the e-letter in which the survey hyperlink would be imbedded.

Minor changes were made to the survey as the result of suggestions by Angeles Rodriguez.

The survey consists of **seven** questions, including a request for comments. **Three** of the questions relate to demographic characteristics of respondents, i.e., respondent age group, gender, and ethnicity.

A hardcopy version of the "Fall 2012 English Assessment – Student Survey" is **attached**.

Survey Population

The survey population consists of **906** students:

Who took the English Assessment Test between February 1, 2012 and August 23, 2012, and Who were enrolled in a fall 2012 English Composition class as of August 24, 2012.

The number of surveyed students, by English Composition class, appears in the table below.

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Survey Administration

On August 27, 2012 an e-letter, containing the SurveyMonkey hyperlink, was e-mailed to each of the **906** students in the survey population. The hyperlink to the survey was closed on September 12, 2012, allowing students **16 days** to respond to the survey.

■ SUMMARY

Response Rate

A total of **92** students, or **10%** of the survey population, responded. Although the response rate is too low to be statistically significant, the results still provide initial insight into students' understanding of the assessment process. The low response rate can probably be attributed to the interval between the time students took the English Assessment Test and the time that the survey was conducted. Depending upon when the student took the English assessment test, the interval could vary from a week to six months.

Demographics of Respondents

In the table below, response percentages for selected demographic groups are compared to the corresponding percentages for the Survey Population. Differences between Respondent and Survey Population percentages are expressed in **percentage points**. <u>Positive</u> numbers indicate **over** representation by survey respondents and <u>negative</u> numbers reflect **under** representation.

Did you know that your test result would be used to recommend which English course for you to take?

84% responded – Yes

Question 2

Did you understand that a prerequisite for a course needs to be met prior to enrolling in the course?

69/8 responded – Yes

Question 3

Did you know about the English Challenge Process?

67% responded – No

Demographics of the respondents who answered "No" to Question 3 closely <u>reflect</u> the overall demographic percentages of <u>all</u> survey respondents.



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■ SURVEY RESULTS

Question 1

At the time that you took the English Assessment Test, did you know that your test result would be used to recommend which English course (ENGL V01A, ENGL V02, or ENGL V03) for you to take?



Question 1 asked students whether they knew that their test result would be used to recommend the English course (ENGL V01A, ENGL V02, or ENGL V03) that they should take. All of the **92** survey respondents answered the question (i.e., there were no "blank" responses).

In the table below, the **overall** response distribution is shown in the **Respondents** section; the evaluative responses are presented in the **Relevant Responses** section. Since there were no "blank" responses, all responses are relevant.

Almost **84%** of respondents indicated that they knew that their test result would be used to recommend the English course that they should take. Percentages of Relevant Responses are graphically depicted in the chart above.



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Question 2

At the time that you took the English Assessment Test, did you understand that a prerequisite for a course needs to be met before you can enroll in that course?

(For example, to enroll in ENGL V01A, you need a certain score on the English Assessment Test, or a grade of C/better in ENGL V02, or an equivalent course or academic experience.)



Question 2 asked students whether they knew that a prerequisite for a course needs to be met before they could enroll in that course. Of the **92** total survey respondents, **89** marked one of the *three* response choices.

In the table below, the **overall** response distribution is shown in the **Respondents** section; the evaluative responses are presented in the **Relevant Responses** section.

Almost **69%** of respondents indicated that they knew that a prerequisite for a course needs to be met before they could enroll in that course. Percentages of Relevant Responses are graphically depicted in the chart above.



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Question 3

At the time that you took the English Assessment Test, did you know about the English Challenge Process (the way to request an English course that is higher than the course recommended by your English Assessment Test score)?



Question 3 asked students whether they knew about the English Challenge Process at the time that they took the English Assessment Test.

Of the **92** total survey respondents, **88** marked one of the *three* response choices.

In the table below, the **overall** response distribution is shown in the **Respondents** section; the evaluative responses are presented in the **Relevant Responses** section.

Sixty-seven percent (67%) of respondents indicated that they did <u>not</u> know about the English Challenge Process at the time that they took the English Assessment Test. Percentages of Relevant Responses are graphically depicted in the chart above.






