Fall 2010 and Spring 2011 - Reading and Writing Center

■ SUMMARY

• Introduction

The Ventura College Reading and Writing Center (R&W Center) is located in the Learning Resource Center, Room LRC-155 and is funded through the college's Title V Institutional Grant. The R&W Center assists students at all reading/writing levels in acquiring the foundational skills they need to improve their (i) reading strategies, (ii) grammatical and rhetorical accuracy in academic writing, and (iii) confidence as learners.

The center's purpose is to support classroom instruction by offering students free, one-on-one faculty workshops, trained peer tutoring, and directed learning activities as a way to reinforce skills expected of students in college courses. In its initial phase, the center offered course-specific help to reading students and students taking English V04, V03 and V02. The R&W Center is now open to all students.

The study period consists of the **fall 2010** and **spring 2011** terms. Data for the study were extracted from SARS-GRID (R&W Center tutoring sessions) and the VCCCD Banner System (final grades).

Overview

Summary data for fall 2010 and spring 2011 are presented in the table below.

Explanations of Tutoring Categories:

SARS-GRID creates multiple records for each tutoring session. For example, a student who received tutoring on November 1, 2010 at 10:30 am in ENGL V03 would have one record for that date with a "Reason Code" of ENGL V03 (or ENGL) and possibly another record with a "Reason Code" of AA/RW (Reading Writing Center).

- (A) "Number of Disciplines in which Tutoring was Provided" is a count of the Disciplines (Subject Codes) in which tutoring services were rendered.
- (B) "Unduplicated Number of Students" is the count of individual students who received tutoring services (many students received tutoring in more than one discipline).
- (C) "Number of Individual Basic-Skills Students" is a count of students who were coded ESL one/more times or who received tutoring in a basic skills ENGL course (I.E., V03, V04A, V07, V08A, V08B, or V09).
- (D) "Number of Student-Tutoring Sessions" is a count of individual "History ID" numbers. A "History ID" number is created for every student-tutoring session. The "History ID" number may have more than one "Reason Code" associated with it, e.g., one "History ID" number had five "Reason Codes" associated with it: AAR/W, ENGL, ENGL V03 71473, ENGL V03 7296, and ENGL V08A 70820.
- (E) "Number of Student-Discipline Sessions" counts all "Reason Codes" that are either a discipline (e.g., ENGL) or a Course ID (e.g., ENGL V03).

Success Rates in Basic Skills Courses

In fall 2010 and spring 2011, overall success rates for students who received tutoring in **basic skills** courses were *higher* than the corresponding rates for non-tutored students in the same sections.

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• Demographics of Tutored Students

In the table below, students who received tutoring in the fall 2010 and/or spring 2011 semesters are categorized by ethnicity and gender. (**Note:** Demographics are indicated *only* for those students for whom one/more grades were obtained from Banner – see Final Grades below.) In spring 2011, **three** students received grades in **two** courses in which they received R&W Center services.

• Gender: The majority of students are female: 65% in fall 2010 and 63% in spring 2011.

• Ethnicity: Hispanic students account for the greatest percentage of tutored students:

59% in fall 2010 and 50% in spring 2011.

■ FINAL GRADES

To obtain a final grade for a course in which a student was tutored, the **Student ID** (900 number) and the **Course ID** are required. The SARS "Reason Code" is the data element in which the Course ID can be entered. In many cases, however, only the Subject Area (e.g., ENGL) was entered and therefore a definitive match could not be attempted. Most of the Tutoring Records which were not matched to grade records are probably related to courses that students dropped during the first four weeks of the term.
