- Do our students exhibit a personal/professional code of ethics and conduct (punctuality, prepared for assignments, meets course outcomes for the entire semester, respects peers and instructors)?
- Do our students collaborate effectively with students from diverse populations and backgrounds?
- Are they registered to vote?
- Are they a community participant?
- Do they have an abbreviated educational plan?
- Have a comprehensive educational plan?
- Have made progress towards successfully completing these plans?
- Have they completed courses related to diversity, cultures and acceptance?
- Participate in diverse groups or cultural activities?

## What is ISLO #5?!

Students will examine the ethical responsibilities and the dynamic role of individuals and active citizens in society.

Students will develop skills and employ strategies to self-manage their personal, academic, and career goals and to cooperate, collaborate, and interact successfully within groups and with a variety of cultures, peoples, and situations.

**Remember, with each of the questions on the left, we need to analyze if students have exceeded, met, or not met expectations.**
