2. Emergency Notification System Update	Grant updated VC's progress on the ENS: A. Most building on our campus have been cabled and dressed. The alert client has been pushed out to all machines on campus and the activation buttons will be pushed out next.	
3. Program Review Ranking Update	1) Grant shared the latest update from our IEE office. They have consolidated our online rankings and we will discuss at our next 2-10-20 TAG meeting.	
4. Smartphone Student ID Badges	1) Grant updated the group with the current progress. New vendors for this project have been setup and PO's are being generated. Once the PO's have been approved, we will work with our ASVC staff to setup the pilot for this smartphone student ID badge project.	
5. Current Progress – 2018-2019 Program Review Initiatives.	1) Grant updated the group on our current progress. We just finished rolling out the last batch of technology refresh for our campus. We are starting the technical design to upgrade 8 smart classrooms and 9 computer labs on campus.	
6. Windows 7 OS End of Life Project	1) Grant described the need to upgrade the 200 machines on campus from Windows 7 to Windows 10. Microsoft stopped supporting Windows 7 and these machines could be a security risk until they have been replaced. This project will be ongoing until all machines have been updated to Windows 10.
