




#### **Ventura College Lock Project**

We are in the process of retrofitting every classroom on campus with a lock that may be

secured from the inside without the need for a key. Most of these new locks will include "locked/unlocked" visual indicators as well. The initial phase of this project has been completed in the Applied Science Center.

Due to the age and specific manufacturer of most of the locks on campus, a retrofit solution was unavailable. To that end, we have had to order new, complete lock units that meet our specifications. We expect the next phase of this project to begin within the next month.







UNLOCKED

During their February meeting, the **Emergency Operations Team** conducted a radio training exercise. The exercise was designed to familiarize the team with proper radio protocols as well as the locations of various safety-related items on campus. ICS 214 Activity Forms were also completed as the event took place. Did YOU know that the blue reflectors on the street were indicators of a nearby fire hydrant?









#### 2019 SPENDING DEADLINE:

The last day to submit requisitions for the 2018-19 fiscal year will be Friday April 5, 2019. No purchasing will be allowed after April 5th, including purchases from blanket purchase orders, petty cash, or procurement cards.

There are a few exceptions as identified below.

- ☐ Supplies required by M&O for repairs
- ☐ Purchase of perishable items for meetings and banquets
- ☐ Unanticipated equipment repairs/maintenance
- ☐ Services from approved consultants and independent contractors with an established purchase order
- ☐ District issued procurement cards for approved travel related expenses

Some payments are difficult to determine this early in the semester or fiscal year. Therefore, direct payments will be allowed for such transactions as scholarships and awards, athletic officials, etc.
