

Twenty Barrier/High-Risk Courses – Increase in Numbers of Successful Hispanic Students

The **twenty** high-risk/barrier courses appearing in the Title V–Velocidad Grant were identified using **success rate** data for the **fall 2010/spring 2011** terms, which serve as the grant’s **baseline** rates.

In the table below, **overall** success rates for Hispanic students in the twenty high-risk/barrier courses are displayed by fall/spring terms from 2011-2012 to 2014-2015. Column (A) indicates the actual numbers of successful students in each fall/spring period; Column (B) depicts numbers of successful students calculated using the baseline success rate of 55.2%. Column (C) shows the increase in the numbers of successful students. Since the implementation of the Velocidad Grant, see **2012-2015**.
