13.04 STUDY SESSION. Student Success Scorecard/Accountability Reporting for the California Community College (ARCC) for Moorpark College, Oxnard College, and Ventura College. College Presidents discussed the Student Success Scorecard/Accountability Reporting for the California Community College (ARCC) and answered Trustee questions.

Moorpark College

Student Profile

The students being reported on in the 2014 scorecard are from 2007-2008 cohorts and have been tracked for six years.

- In Fall 2012, 71% of our students declared Transfer as their educational goal, an increase of 6% points since 2007.
- 75% of students are under the age of 25.
- 10% increase in Hispanic students over the last five years, reaching 27% in Fall 2012.
- Decreases continue to occur in unduplicated annual headcount (down about 13% from the previous year) and FTES (down 6% from the previous year). Decreases are attributed to budgetary constraints that led to the decreases in course offerings and changes in the regulations regarding course repeatability.

Completion

- Overall, 61% of these students complete their educational program.
- The rates for completion differ significantly between prepared (72%) and unprepared (44%) students.

Persistence

- 73% of these first-time students persisted through their first three terms. This momentum point may be associated with higher levels of student engagement, direction, and focus.
- The persistence rates for college-prepared students (75%) and unprepared students (71%) are similar.

Achievement of 30 Units

- 73% of these students achieved the milestone of attaining 30 units.
- While 76% of our college-prepared students have achieved this milestone, the rate is lower for unprepared students at 67 percent.

Remedial Improvement Rates for English, Math and ESL

- The English improvement rate is the highest it has been for the last five cohorts at 53%. Students who started in a below-transfer-level-English course are considered to have "improved" if they complete a college-level course in English within 6 years.
- Mathematics improvement rates are presently at 41%, which is 3% higher than the cohort five years ago.
- The ESL improvement rates for the last five cohorts have fluctuated from the mid-20 percent to mid-30 percent range.

CTE Completion

• Slightly more than 68% of our CTE students attained a degree, certificate, or transferred. This is the largest cohort for the past five years and shows the increased demand for these programs.

Oxnard College

Student Profile (AY 2012-13)

- OC continues to be designated as a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI)
- Over 78% of OC students are from ethnic minority groups with Hispanics representing 66.4% of the student body.
- Decreases in unduplicated annual headcount (down 1.7%) continue, but at a much slower rate. The 3.5% decrease in FTES,
 however, is greater than last year indicating that students may be taking fewer units. Reduction in classes and other economic
 factors are also reflected in 'momentum' indicators such as persistence and overall progress, particularly for prepared students.
- Demographically, the percent of 20-24 year olds continues to increase. The percentage of male students which has been creeping up over the past four cohorts has leveled off.

<u>Completion</u> (AY 2007-08 six year cohort – Percent receiving an award, transferring, or becoming transfer prepared within six years)

- The overall completion rate for Oxnard students is up slightly (43.6%). Not only do the rates for completion differ greatly between prepared (66.0%) and unprepared (37.5%) students, the rate decreased from the previous cohort for prepared students, while it increased for students who are not prepared for college.
- While we do not like to see any decrease in the rate of completion, given that over 80% of the current cohort is considered unprepared achieving an increase in overall completion for these students is promising.

Persistence (AY 2007-08 six year cohort – Percent enrolling in first three subsequent terms)

- The persistence rate (enrolled in each of the first three terms) is still lower for prepared students (47.3%) than for unprepared students (57.6%). This may be due to prepared students being more likely to transfer within 3 terms.
- The persistence rate increased for unprepared students indicating that recent policies initiated to retain students are beginning to show results.

30 Units (AY 2007-08 six-year cohort – Percent earning 30 units within six years)

• Students both prepared and unprepared achieved the progress measure of attaining 30 units at a rate of ~ 65%. This is a slight increase for unprepared, but a nearly 8% decrease for prepared students. While this is puzzling, the rate of prepared students attaining 30 units has had large fluctuations up and down over the past five years. Still, we would like to see the increases for prepared students remain constant.

Remedial (AY 2007-08 six-year cohort - Percent enrolling in college level course within six years)

- Math improvement rates increased to nearly 27% from the prior cohort. In response to prior cohort outcomes, the Math
 Department has implemented the Transitional Math program, which is expected to help students transition into college level
 Math more effectively. As such, we expect this trend to continue.
- English improvement rates dropped about 2% to 36.7% after 4 years of a relatively steady rate. Hispanic students represent ~80% of the students in the remedial English cohort and have seen the rates of transitioning to college English dropping with each of the last five cohorts.
- Of students starting in ESL, about 8.5% complete a course in college level English within 6 years, up by 4% over the prior years' cohort.
- Despite showing increases in some instances, the Scorecard data for the transition from remedial classes to colleges level Math and/or English is still low overall. To address the issue of remedial transition, Oxnard College has put into motion a

reorganization plan for remedial level Math, English, and ESL in which an Asst. Dean will oversee an independent division dedicated solely to the needs of remedial level students.

CTE Completion (AY 2007-08 six-year cohort)

 CTE cohorts continue to complete at a higher rate (58.3%) compared to 43.6% for the overall cohorts of degree/transfer seeking students. CTE programs have made a concerted effort encouraging their students to get their certificates and degrees even if they have found employment as a result of their coursework.

Ventura College

Student Profile

- Ventura College continues to be designated as a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI).
- Nearly 65% of Ventura College students report ethnicity from minority groups with Hispanics representing 52.5% of the student body.
- The college served 9,818 full-time equivalent students.
- Age of students attending the college was distributed as 32% under 20 years old, 35.4% between 20 to 24 years old, and 22.5% between 25 to 49 years old. Students over 50 years old represented 10.1% of the student population of the college.
- Female students represented 55% and male students represented 45% of the student population at Ventura College.

Completion

- Students obtaining an associate degree, certificate, or meeting transfer criteria are counted towards completion. The overall completion rate for the cohort was 54.3%.
- The completion rate for prepared students was 69.4% compared to 43.8% for unprepared students. The college's Basic Skills
 Committee is focused on identifying and coordinating strategies to help students successfully acquire the basic skills needed to
 succeed in college-level coursework.
- The completion rate for Hispanic students was 49.7%, which is below the cohort average and lower than most of the other
 ethnic groups. The college's Velocidad Title 5 grant is specifically identifying ways to improve success and completion across
 ethnicity in identified barrier courses.

Persistence

• The overall persistence rate (enrolled in first three consecutive terms) averaged 66.4% for the Student Success Scorecard cohort at Ventura College and has increased compared to 59% for the previous year. Persistence was greater for prepared (67.8%) compared to underprepared (65.4%) students.

30 Units

- The percentage of the cohort reaching at least 30 units over six years averaged 72.7% and was similar between prepared and unprepared students.
- There was a difference based upon student age range. A lower percentage of students in the 25 to 49 years old and over 50
 years old categories achieved 30 units. The assumption is that these students are more likely to focus on one or a few courses
 for skill development or improvement.

Remedial

- This measure indicates the percentage of students who started below college level and subsequently completed a college level course in the same discipline. The remedial completion rates were 30.6% for math, 45.3% for English, and 5.4% for ESL.
- Progress is occurring in improving the percentage of students starting below college level and then completing a college level course in that same discipline. The remedial numbers last year were 17.7% for math, 31.7% for English, and 4.2% for ESL
- The data indicates the continuing challenge the college faces in focusing effort on improving the progress of our underprepared students.
- Improvement in progression of students from below college level to college level courses is being identified in Velocidad Title 5
 grant activities and through efforts of the Basic Skills committee. In addition, implementation of Student Success and Support
 Program and Equity initiatives will help to improve persistence and completion of both underprepared and college prepared
 students.
- The college partners with the Ventura Unified School District Adult Education Center and refers ESL students to courses most appropriate to assessed language level.

CTE Completion

• The completion rate of CTE cohort students was 57.5%. CTE students are often focused on degree and/or certificate completion in preparation for entry into a career area. The college has a career center to support student research, entry, and

- completion of CTE programs.
- The college will also be considering and developing new certificates and degrees in the CTE area as part of the Career Pathways grant that also align directly with employer needs.
