	VC East campus is continuing to experiencing connectivity issues, but IT is working diligently on it. G. Jones reported that the DAC is looking at alternatives means to make sure that it is up and running. Possible cause may be due to equipment being damaged or destroyed.	
	VC is currently in the middle of screening candidates for the VP of Academic Affairs position. Scheduled interviews for December 3 rd .	
	Executive team is reviewing categorical funding in order to create a Pirate Emergency Grant for students experiencing financial hardship. The funds granted could be anywhere from \$500 to \$1000 for last minute payments. It is still in the infancy phase. More information to come.	
5. CPC ItemsTaskforce Updates	P. Briggs gave a quick update regarding the Taskforces that were created at the previous CPC meeting.	
 Committee co-chair training Strategic Plan Evaluation Program Viability Task Force 	J. Day and S. Royer to provide information for the Committee co-chair training. The information gathered will most likely come from the participatory handbook and the duties of the various participants listed. The taskforce will work on gathering ideas for content and develop a plan for moving forward. Once all of the committee chairs are selected for the various committees on campus, a workshop will be given and then followed up with handouts.	
	The Strategic Plan Evaluation taskforce may meet in a couple weeks. The next plan will cover a 6-year plan. The plan is to improve access to different populations. Many things in the plan now are somewhat outdated. The goal for the taskforce is to identify and update those items that are outdated then take it to the board once they have been approved by the Senates and ASVC. Theoretically, it would be ideal to have it	

	done by the end of the 2020 Spring semester.	
	N. Duangpun, P. Briggs, L. Morales met recently. R. Petitfils will join the taskforce at the next meeting. They have four meetings planned for the end of the semester. R. Petitfils looked at some other schools to compare to ours and found that our BP is very vague. The AS reviewed and approved this BP in 2013, so it is very old. L. Morales reported that the AS has an outline of things that they want to get very specific on and will discuss at the next senate meeting. D. Newcomb said that it would be nice to have a Career Education representative on that taskforce. R. Fernandez expressed interest and added that he can make it work. P. Briggs explained that the Program Viability is in summary for those who are not aware of how the process works. It is a very long process and there are specific steps that we need to go through to determine the viability of a program, but there is no functional process on this campus for that at this time. J. Vega asked for clarification on who would be on the task force to represent services; however, the BP covers instructional programs only. P. Briggs said that it would be ideal to have a process for all programs.	
	N. Duangpun felt that it would be good to look at all of them at the same time. R. Fernandez feels that instruction is very different from the services and others felt that they are completely different. It is still early in the process for figuring something out.
