For the most recent fall semester (fall 2015):

- College of the Siskiyous had the highest rate in the state (78.5\%).
- L.A. Southwest College had the lowest rate in the state (58.8\%).
- The overall statewide rate was $69.7 \%$.
- VC's rate was 72.3\%.

The percentage of first-time degree-, certificate-, or transfer-seeking students who completed a degree, certificate, transferred to a 4-year university, or completed transfer requirements within six years.

## What is VC's 6-Year Completion Rate? How does it compare to other colleges?

For the most recent cohort (2009-2010):

- De Anza College had the highest completion rate in the state (65.6\%).
- Lassen College had the lowest rate in the state (23.6\%).
- The overall statewide rate was $47.1 \%$.
- VC's rate was 50.9\%.

Many students take multiple years of basic-skills level English and Math courses before they are prepared for transfer-level courses. Our "Sail to Success" initiative is focused on ensuring that entering students are ready to enroll in transfer-level math and English courses within one year.
