
CONGRATULATIONS to Criminal Justice Faculty, Bryan

DID YOU KNOW?

Financial Aid is available for Summer!

Students who are meeting satisfactory academic progress and are enrolled in at least 6 units during the summer may qualify for financial aid!

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

In order for a student to receive financial aid, they must meet the Qualitative, Quantitative, and Max Time components of SAP Qualitative Standard: A 2.00 minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) in all coursework attempted

Quantitative Standard: A 67% minimum course completion in all coursework attempted

Max Time Standard: Attempted units may not exceed 150% of the number of units required to complete your educational objective

The deadline to turn in Summer SAP appeals is 1st level- June 25th and 2nd level- July 9th

Loan Application Deadlines

The deadline to turn in loan requests for Summer is July 16, 2019



The Governor's May Revise

Governor Newsom released his May Revision to his proposed 2019-20 State budget. The following items have changed from his initial proposal in January:

- ⇔ Cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) revised from 3.46% to 3.26%
- Additional \$150M one-time contribution to CalSTRS reducing the employer contribution rate to 16.7%
- ➡ Increase of \$5M for a total of \$45M to fund the second year of the California College Promise
- ⇒ \$40M for deferred maintenance, instructional equipment, and specified water conservation projects (zero dollars were proposed in January)
- ⇒ Student Centered Funding Formula (SCFF)
 - Maintained January proposal to continue 2018-19 SCFF component percentages for 2019-20 (70% Base, 20% Supplemental, 10% Student Success)
 - Maintained January proposal to cap year-to-year growth of Student Success allocation to 10%
 - Maintained January proposal to adjust definition of transfer metric to identify which district gets credit for the transfer
 - May Revise proposes to extend hold harmless time frame through 2021-22

PROJECT UPDATES BY DEPARTMENT

FACILITIES, MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS

We have received more than 150 work requests for Summer: 50 requests for carpet cleaning and waxing of floors for a variety of classrooms, offices and hallways throughout the campus. 30 requests for cleaning of windows, blinds, sills, and vents. 11 requests for paint which are being added to our regular schedule of repainting parking areas. 3 requests for extensive electrical work. Additionally, we have received multiple requests involving furniture moves/removal/repair, and various requests to replace doors, gates, ceiling tiles and moldings.

A revised and prioritized project list will be forthcoming.

Creating a new 24-seat computer lab in Classroom #4 at East Campus

Implementing a new Zoom Room AV enhancement for LRC 128
