President's Message

Aye Pirates! Welcome to the 2018-2019 school year! This year is starting off with such a wonderful and unexpected estate gift from Miriam Schwab, a local philanthropist and long-time Ventura College supporter. I announced at the September 11th Board of Trustees meeting that the VC Foundation would be receiving more than \$12 million from Miriam Schwab's estate. Ventura College is planning many celebrations to honor her legacy beginning with a special concert on October 13 (more information to come). Miriam played with our symphony for more than a decade.

This most generous gift will go to support both the instrument music (85%) and the aquatics program (15%). I am currently work with the college and foundation leadership teams to develop an implementation plan.

In the meantime, the VC ship has set sail toward guided pathways, strategic enrollment management, and building community on campus. Hopefully you all know that our first guided pathways retreat is scheduled for this Friday, September 21! The retreat will focus primarily on the first guided pathways pillar- Clarifying the Path. Hope to see many of you there.

Although our enrollment is experiencing a slight increase, we are still looking for ways to sustain and increase growth. This year we are focusing significant attention toward our East Campus and the Santa Clara River Valley area. In January, we plan to begin two associate degree programs at the East Campus. Our VCEC students will, for the first time, be able to take all degree requirements without coming to the main campus. In addition, we are working with our feeder high schools, with emphasis on Santa Paula and Fillmore, to increase dual enrollment of high school students. Ultimately, the goal is to have all high school students graduating from high school with 15-30 college credits.

Finally, we will continue to build community focusing on keeping people safe on campus. We are in the process of developing clean and clear communication and procedural protocols for the BICT process. These new protocols will be shared campus-wide in the coming weeks. We will be spending a substantial amount of time this year training executive team members and building monitors on emergency and disaster response.



The Ventura College Athletics program was named the 2017-18 Western State Conference Athletics Supremacy Award winner for overall athletic achievement for the academic year. The award is the school's 20th overall title, the highest total in conference history. Ventura claimed the Supremacy title thanks to a consistent performance across all 18 of its Western State Conference sponsored sports. The Pirates earned points in 17 of the 18 WSC sports they sponsored, including winning titles in men's basketball, women's basketball and men's tennis. VC also boasted the third highest overall GPA of all the WSC schools, with an overall GPA of 3.09. Go HERE for more!



FALL 2018 Enrollment

For Fall 2018, VC's student head count has increased around 2%, along with an increase in unit enrollment 0.85% as of September 5th. Additionally, the college has over 55 late-start classes scheduled for October.

2018-19 Adoption Budget for September Board Approval

The impact of the new Student Centered Funding Formula still isn't known, so the Adoption Budget was built using the "hold-harmless" provision in the new model. This amount reflects the same apportionment revenue from the prior year plus COLA.

The District shifted 590 FTES districtwide from the Summer 2018 term into 2017-18 increasing that year's funded FTES, therefore increasing the hold-harmless revenue calculation.
