department is interested in adding to the AA-T. It is proposed for C-ID, but currently not proposed for General Education. He explained that ENGL V01C is being scaled from 4 units to 3 units and that while it was originally going to be proposed as ENGL V12, the ID was changed to align with Moorpark College so there is less confusion. J. Guelcher expanded by explaining that ENGL V01C is a more

advanced course, and provides a clearer path for students on which courses to take. He also mentioned that the course is designed to be more theme orientated, based on the students who are taking the course. M. Bowen explained that POSC V01 is a course that was previously reviewed and approved, but is now being revised because DTRW-I suggested POSC V01A be added as a prerequisite. He explained that students who take the POSC V89A experimental course will have to petition for it to be approved in place of POSC V01A. M. Bowen also clarified that the Elementary Teacher

Education ADT still has two courses missing C-ID approval, but that the department is looking to get locally approved so that once all courses are approved for C-ID, it can be immediately submitted to the

State Chancellor's office for approval.

The state is changing the categories for CSU GE pattern. Sections D0-D9 are removing subcategories and are changing the category to one lump Social Science category. If a student takes a GE applicable Social Science course after this change, when the discipline classifications go away,

students will still be required to take courses from two different disciplines, they will no longer be able to take multiple courses from the same discipline. Counselors need to be aware that students cannot take a course from two different areas. This may affect how we name some of our courses because students will be limited.
