III. GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS, INTRODUCTIONS, AND PUBLIC COMMENTS (Information)^{*}

M. Bowen introduced the new agenda format, stating that inspiration came from Berkeley City College. Comments were favorable to the new format.

M. Bowen noted the guests in attendance and acknowledged that the meeting was his first as co-chair. He raised a point of order to suspend the time limit as stated on the agenda and allow guests G. Arevalo and M. Nungaray the opportunity to speak with the same rights as other members of the committee. There was no opposition.

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: April 21, 2015 (Discussion/Action)

M. Bowen called for a motion to approve the minutes.

Motion by R. Petitfils, second by N. Fredrickson

Discussion: A. Kolesnik noted that he was listed as a guest but should have been listed as a voting member per the Academic Senate Bylaws. M. Bowen noted the need to update the Curriculum Committee bylaws to reflect Academic Senate President as an ex officio voting member.

V. **REPORTS** (Information)

A. Co-chairs

M. Bowen reported that the ADT degree in Philosophy was pulled from the 2015-16 VC catalog by administration and that the decision was made without the consultation of faculty. The degree has been submitted to the state but not approved due to a course (PHIL V04) not having C-ID approval. G. Arevalo noted that the practice of listing pending degrees in the catalog was discontinued districtwide due to accreditation and other complications it causes for students. A discussion ensued that included suggestions to improve communication and CurricUNET.

B. Articulation/C-ID

M. Bowen stated that our campus is currently without an Articulation Officer (AO.) He shared that he has obtained a log-in for C-ID and has been forwarding the information on regarding course C-ID status. He shared that over the summer break, President Gillespie arranged for the AOs from our sister campuses to complete our submissions

G. Arevalo reiterated the State Chancellor's office announcement (<u>AA 15-04</u>), that effective July 1, 2015 all courses entered on a TMC template where a C-ID descriptor is listed must have a C-ID status of "Approved."

P. Sezzi inquired about the long term plan for an AO. *K.* Hoffmans stated that the current recruitment closes on September 9th. *M.* Bowen stated that the hope is to have someone in place by November, plus or minus a month.

C. DTRW-I

M. Bowen attended the last DTRW-I meeting held April 9, 2015, he provided the <u>draft</u> <u>minutes</u> to those present. The next meeting is scheduled for August 27, 2015.

D. Subcommittees/Workgroups No report.

E. CurricUNET/Banner/TracDat

M. Bowen stated that there are currently several pending fix requests submitted for CurricUNET. He noted that there are several hundred courses in CurricUNET without Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs.) It was asserted that the reason for the missing SLOs was a result of the course not being offered, therefore, there would not be any SLOs to assess. A discussion transpired that included discussion of the priority one list and its distribution, and the factors that determine priority of course review (highest being C-ID.) M. Bowen stated that the choice that needs to be made is to enter SLOs or remove the course. G. Arevalo stated that articulation agreements by major needed to be checked as well, as students are held to those agreements. M. Nungaray stated that it is a problem if we cannot offer courses we advertise in our catalog, students are unable to get their major preparation. D. Newcomb stated that the dilemma is that courses cannot be offered if we cannot fill them.

F. Other

1. Conclusion of Curriculum Committee Training

M. Bowen tabled this item in order to move the agenda forward.

VI. POLICY AND PROCESS (Information or Discussion/Action)

A. Select Members for Philosophy and General Education Work Group

M. Bowen noted that each year we need to constitute this workgroup in order to review new courses with general education proposals. We need one member from each division. The workgroup meets three or four times a year, usually in the hour prior to curriculum. He stated those willing to take on the role for their division need to identify yourself to him or O. Long. R. Petitfils, D. Newcomb (CTE), N. Fredrickson (KIN), and P. Sezzi (English) volunteered.

VII. CONSENT AGENDA: CURRICULAR PROPOSALS FOR APPROVAL (Discussion/Action; see attachment)

M. Bowen presented the Foreign Language deletions. G. Arevalo noted the need for the incoming AO to request to terminate any articulation agreements associated with the courses. D. Newcomb inquired if the department chair was aware of the articulation ramifications. M. Bowen replied in the negative. A brief discussion occurred that that touched on alternatives for students. M. Bowen called for a motion, either to approve the consent agenda or to table *it.*

Newcomb replied in the negative, she stated that the first chapter of the textbook is math review. Motion by D. Newcomb, second by G. Arquilevich

Discussion: The discussion centered on making the recommended preparation more specific. M. Bowen called for an amendment to the original motion, to approve the first reading of the course with the intent to investigate if MATH V10 would be an applicable solution.

R. Koerner inquired about the timeline to obtain approval to add distance education for spring 2016. *M.* Bowen stated that the inquiry would be discussed at the next Technical Review meeting and brought back.

The calendar of meetings was reviewed, noting the revision of the October 6th meeting to September 29th (which will be the last meeting to make November Board.) N. Duangpun noted that the meeting scheduled on March 1, 2016 is a self-assigned flex day. A suggestion was made to keep the meeting date of October 6th for training, with a request for CurricUNET training.

D. Newcomb shared a concern (that had been raised before) regarding Proficiency Awards (PA) and the need to have a system to track them. PAs are issued by departments and are not transcribed. She stated that Susan Bricker (former Registrar) was able to populate them behind the scenes in banner, and the division administrative assistant who processes and prints them should be able to track them. Somewhere at somepoint in this process, something fell through and currently the PAs are still going untracked. D. Newcomb requested the issue be investigated and fixed. She stated that the lack of tracking translates to being unable to report during program review and the departments do not get credit for their PAs. K. Hoffmans stated she would look into it and mentioned Argos.
