

PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT AND APPROVAL PROCEDURES

INTRODUCTION

Purpose

Ventura College's Program Announcement (PA) and approval procedures were developed to provide a rational and effective method of program and degree development, consideration, and approval. College procedures need to provide mechanisms for ensuring that consistent and coordinated decisions are made concerning program development and resource allocation. The underlying principle that informs the entire program approval process at a college is collaborative open consideration by all relevant parties of all program information at the departmental and college levels. The existing process at Ventura College does not complete new program review in the most effective and timely manner. The updated process has program information gathered earlier and provides detailed and more effective information that can be used at all phases of discussion and approval by the college and state groups.

This new Program Announcement and Approval Procedures document extends the Ventura County Community College District Administrative Procedure 4020 process of basic curriculum and program considerations for the District's colleges. This extension includes a faster and more thorough program concept approval procedure and program announcement approval procedure. The final responsibility for program approval rests with Ventura Community College District Board of Trustees. Once approved by the college, new programs must also be reviewed and approved by the state before offering courses at the college.

PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT AND APPROVAL PROCEDURES

This new program announcement and approval process is designed to encourage effective collegial discussion at various levels at the College. The process begins at the faculty level and then involves a wide range of relevant parties at the college level. This program process will be used for all programs including certificates, and transfer, local, and career degrees when a degree does not exist at VC. See Appendix A for outline of report contents.

Timeline

To meet the estimated timeline for creating programs it is important to consider the schedule of meetings of governing committees, in particular the Curriculum Committee, at VC that need to review your proposal. While program development times vary greatly depending upon a variety of factors, generally the program approval process can be accomplished in one year.

Program Concept Approval

1. The faculty member, assisted by the department chair, representing the proposed program will write a one paragraph concept summary of the program including program quality,

relevance to the community, and student needs met by the program. Next, a faculty member requests a meeting of department faculty from the department that would contain the program to ask for program concept approval. The Program Approval Form must be signed by faculty present at this meeting to show concept approval of a new program. The basic considerations for concept approval include: meeting student needs, the program is reasonable, and it is not a duplication of existing programs.

2. A faculty member and department chair representing the proposed program request a meeting with the Vice President of Academic Affairs and the Dean of the division that would contain the program. If the dean and VP approve the new program concept, they then sign the approval form. The basic considerations for concept approval include: meeting student needs, the program is reasonable, and it is not a duplication of existing programs.

Program Announcement Approval

- The relevant dean and department chair will assist, as needed, the faculty member creating the PA document. The PA is a detailed document containing the rationale, need, and cost for developing a program. The PA should describe the curriculum and requirements for admission and graduation, identify faculty and other program resources, and provide information about opportunities for graduates. In developing a program, the College Mission and the College Strategic Plan should be considered.
- 2. Upon completion the PA document is presented to the Ventura College Program Advisory Group.
- 3. The Program Advisory Group will assess the quality and administrative structure of a new program along with its comparison to other pre-existing programs at the college or in the District. The Program Advisory Group consists of the following members: a faculty representative from department proposing program, Vice President of Academic Affairs, Budget and Resource Committee Chairs, Dean of Division containing the proposed program, Curriculum Committee Faculty Co-Chair, Academic Senate President, Classified Senate President, Counseling Department Chair, Student ASVC President, Financial Aid representative, Curriculum Technician, and the Articulation Officer. The Program Advisory Group reviews a proposed program's PA document and determines if the proposed program is viable and does not exceed or change the programmatic mission of the college and is not unduly duplicative of existing programs. In addition, the advisory group determines if the proposed program's cost and additional resources can be funded with the current available budget of the college. The Program Advisory Group's meeting minutes will contain the discussion results of the review of a proposed program and any minority opinion discussion. A program will not be forwarded to the Curriculum Committee for consideration without a completed PA document and a majority approval of the Program Advisory Group.
- 4. After recommendation(s) by the Program Advisory Group and the chair of the group has signed the Program Approval Form, the faculty representative of the proposed program would follow the program approval procedures specified in the VC Curriculum Handbook to initiate Curriculum Committee approval for the new program. After VC Curriculum Committee approval and district technical review the new program can be presented to the District Board of Trustees for approval.

APPENDIX A

PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT (PA) DOCUMENT

The PA describes a program and its objectives. The PA is used to inform the campus leadership, local governing boards of an institution, and the state. The information in this document is also used by the college data technicians when applying for state approvals.

Program Announcement Document Format

Title Page

- Department

Program Goals and Objectives

Description of the nature of the program, its objectives, the rationale for it, the skills or knowledge that students will acquire, and the relationship of the proposed program to the general field.

Meeting Student Needs

Description of the employment, intellectual, artistic, cultural, social, or economic need for the program. Employment opportunities should be clearly delineated. Evidence of student demand and projected enrollments for the first five years of the program should be specified. The enrollment projection should include estimates of full-time-equivalents and total number of students anticipated.

Other Programs in the State and Area

Description of similar programs in the state and surrounding region, with particular attention given to programs that are geographically close to the campus proposing the program. In the case of similar programs, descriptions of the similarities and differences are particularly important.

Educational Program

Description of the academic program, including:

- 1. Statement of student learning outcomes: the knowledge, skills, and competencies that students are expected to exhibit upon successful completion of this academic program.
- 2. Statement of the measures, tools, and strategies that will be used to assess the student's achievement of the program's learning outcomes.
- 3. Admissions requirements
- 4. Graduation requirements
- 5. Curriculum degree program detailing courses and completion requirements

- 6. Transferability of credits
- 7. Potential for articulation with other institutions.
- 8. Typical course sequence, identifying required, and elective courses and optimum sequence

Faculty Expertise and Workload

Description of existing and needed faculty resources to launch and sustain the program, including:

- 1. List of current faculty and areas of expertise
- 2. List of faculty to be hired and areas of expertise
- 3. Estimate of the percentage of faculty time devoted to the program
- 4. Need for adjunct faculty

Program Administration

Description of how the program will be administered, who will direct the program, and the reporting arrangements. Description of advisory board, if applicable.

Program Review

Description of the college's external peer cyclical review process and any additional kinds of program review that are planned, e.g., self-evaluation or external accreditation.

Course descriptions

Brief summaries of the courses that comprise the program, noting which courses already exist and which are to be developed.

CTE Program Considerations

Describe CTE program requirements including: advisory committee, apprenticeship, regional board approvals, and a market study.

Budget Considerations

The budget should detail the following with importance given to noting a distinction between existing and new resources:

- 1. Faculty Information
- 2. Classified Information
- 3. Library Resources
- 4. Facility Resources
- 5. Computer resources
- 6. Equipment Resources
- 7. Additional Resource Documentation
- 8. Assessment activities, includes projected costs of measures and tools to be used in the evaluation of the achievement of the program's learning outcomes.

The identification of all available and needed resources is a key aspect of the approval process. Resource needs must be identified and committed in order to move the program forward through the approval process. Memoranda detailing resource commitments and identifying offices responsible for all new program resources should be included with the budget description.

Faculty Information

Information summary for each of the faculty who will participate in the new program.

Classified Information

Information summary for each of the classified staff who will participate in the new program.

Library Resources

Assessment of the impact a new program will have on the Library System. When new resources are required for collections or services, a statement must be included describing how existing resources are to be reallocated to cover the new demands.

Facility Resources

Assessment of the impact a new program will have on the college facilities. Explain if existing facilities can support the program or are there facility changes required or new facilities needed.

Computer Resources

Assessment of the impact a new program will have on computer resources within the department and college-wide.

Equipment Resources

Information about equipment required by the new program. Describe existing equipment that could be used and what new equipment is needed.

Additional Resource Documentation

Description of additional program needs and sources of funding available.
