Proposals to Modify the COR

Proposal Number 1

Identify Course Objectives associated with Course Content and Lab Content.

Rationale

Each Course Objective should be affiliated with one or more <u>major</u> topics in Course Content and/or Lab Content, and

Each major topic in Course Content should support one or more Course Objectives.

(Note: Linking Course Objectives to Course Content topics is required at Moorpark College.)

Application

Course proposal authors would enter the Objective letter/number at the end of each <u>major</u> topic in Course Content or Lab Content.

Proposal Number 2

Identify estimated percentage of class time allocated to topics in Course Content/Lab Content.

<u>Rationale</u>

It is helpful for articulation purposes to have percentages of class time devoted to <u>major</u> Content topics appear in the COR. For some courses, the Articulation Officer has needed to forward class syllabuses to UC or CSU faculty so they can determine if our areas of emphasis matches theirs.

(Note: Percentage of class time by content topic is required at Moorpark College.)

Application

Course proposal authors would enter the estimated percentage of class time allocated to each <u>major</u> topic in Course Content and Lab Content. Percentages in <u>each</u> of the content areas (Course Content and Lab Content) must total 100%.

Proposal Number 3

Replace the In-Class Assignments matrix with a text box.

Rationale

Preparing the matrix is a tedious process and it is not easily interpreted by VC or UC/CSU faculty and staff.

(Note: Oxnard and Moorpark colleges both use a text box format.)

<u>Application</u>

Course proposal authors would type representative In-Class Assignments in a text box. Currently, authors check off boxes (specifying particular assignments/student activities) in the In-Class Assignments matrix. Note that there is also a text box (Other/Comments) in the current format.
