3:35pm - CDL N103: Steve Turner is here to discuss the new noncredit course and noncredit certificate plan. Course would fit into a broader certificate program discussed at the last Curriculum Committee Meeting – ICAN. It would provide cognitively diverse students and those on the autism spectrum job seeking strategies, computer skills, and electives in office environments in the process of just one year. A "guided pathway" for students who will not be transferring, and instead interested in this noncredit certificate. Feedback from parents of

students and community so far regarding the idea of this program has been positive.

Both credit and noncredit courses will be in the catalog that fall under this umbrella. This program is innovative, and VC would be the only one in the county to have a certificate program aimed at assisting students specifically on the autism spectrum.

Criteria A. Appropriateness to Mission

1. Statement of goals and objectives for existing program, including new changes.

The Associate in Science in Administration of Justice for Transfer Degree is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. Students completing the degree are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major. A student graduating with an Associate of Science in Administration of Justice for Transfer Degree may transfer to a CSU campus with the competencies needed to complete a bachelor's degree in Criminology, Administration of Justice, Sociology, or Forensic Science.

Program Student Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Administration of Justice program, students will be able to:

- Articulate the American Criminal Justice System, role within the community and the scope of responsibilities of the various local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies, beginning with arrest, through corrections.
- Articulate the major criminological theories regarding criminal behavior, the social implications of crime, and how these concepts relate to crime, criminal behavior, and victimology.
- Analyze concepts of law and utilize legal investigative proficiencies applied to preparing and presenting case work. Demonstrate the ability to translate this information to written, verbal, and electronic formats.
- Collaborate to describe the importance of standards relating to ethics, communication, and cooperation within a variety of cultures and situations in the Criminal Justice System.

2. Catalog Description

The Administration of Justice transfer degree offers students an education in the varied aspects of law enforcement, court procedures, and corrections. A foundation of knowledge is provided for those interested in becoming competitive candidates for these rewarding and challenging positions.

Public concern with rising crime rates and the increasing role of law enforcement in public service work has contributed to the growth of criminal justice agencies throughout the nation. There is a broad range of employment opportunities for men and women in all components of the criminal justice system. The criminal justice system is a diversified occupational area with available employment opportunities on the federal, state, and county levels: Federal Bureau of Investigation; Department of Homeland Security; U.S. Border Patrol; California Highway Patrol; county sheriff's departments; municipal police departments; federal and state departments of correction, probation, and parole; and private security.

Associate in Science in Administration of Justice for Transfer Degree

The Associate in Science in Administration of Justice for Transfer Degree (Administration of Justice AS-T) is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. Students completing the degree are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major.

A student graduating with an Associate in Science in Administration of Justice for Transfer Degree may transfer to a CSU campus to complete a bachelor's degree in Criminology, Administration of Justice, Sociology, or Forensic Science.

To earn an Associate in Science in Administration of Justice for Transfer Degree, students must complete the following requirements:

- (1) Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
 - (A) The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education-Breadth Requirements.
 - (B) A minimum of 18 semester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
- (2) Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0 on transfer courses.
- Obtainment of a "C" grade or better, or "P," in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis. Although a "P" grade is allowed (Title 5, Section 55063), it is recommended that students take each major course for a letter grade (A, B, or C) due to unit limitations on "P/NP" courses.
- (4) Complete a minimum of 12 units in residency at the college granting the degree.
