A. Discussion regarding the proposed Academic Senate resolution on courses not recently offered (Discussion/Action) – M. Bowen

The Academic Senate drafted a resolution that would prohibit the Curriculum Committee from deleting any courses.

A handout was presented to the group – M. Bowen's written rebuttal to the proposal. The last page of the handout is the Senate's draft resolution.

This item is on the next Senate agenda as a discussion item. M. Bowen will be attending and will present the rebuttal as his personal response. It was shared with the Curriculum Committee for review and information. Should the committee like to endorse or modify the rebuttal, that is possible, and rebuttal could be presented as a response from the body as a whole IF it is the will of the committee. In that case, M. Bowen would speak as a representative of the Curriculum Committee at the Senate meeting.

Discussion:

Is there an advantage to having the rebuttal be presented to the Senate in advance of the meeting so they are prepared for the discussion? Is that compliant with the Brown Act? The Brown Act does not prohibit one way communication/sharing information, but Senators cannot engage in a discussion outside of appointed meeting time.

In response to this, the group decided to have the rebuttal presented at the time of the meeting and not shared with the Senators before to make sure they were in compliance with the rules.

Curriculum Committee group decided to take the time to review the rebuttal and let M. Bowen know if they are comfortable with endorsing the statement. M. Bowen is open to recommendations for changes.

K. Hoffmans publically supported Michael Bowen and his efforts as Curriculum Committee Chair, faculty member of VC, and his desire to present factual information as to why it is necessary to have an accurate catalog. She stated that she believes this body (Curriculum Committee) tries to provide the most robust, clean, and high-quality curriculum, and presenting a college catalog that reflects what we actually offer is just another step in this process.
