B. Limiting Spring Implementation Dates (Discussion/Action) – M. Bowen

There has been discussion in the Tech Review committee of limiting our process to use only Fall implementation dates with a small number of "emergency" exceptions (accreditation issues being an example of one)

Spring implementation causes difficulty in post-approval and articulation processes

Would it satisfy the committee if we have a process of Spring implementations in emergency situations only? What would determine it to be an "emergency"?

For a process, it was recommended that Tech Review committee would recommend whether a course should be considered for Spring on the Curriculum Committee agenda, and then a 2/3 vote at the Curriculum Committee meeting would be needed for *implementation.* When the course is submitted, the owner of the course should communicate to the Tech Review group regarding the reasoning behind the need for a Spring implementation.

Committee to take this back to their departments, and brainstorming will continue on best process to choose. Committee was in agreement that limiting Spring implementation dates is ok. No motion was needed.
