## I. Procedures

A. Shall the P\&GE workgroup agree (for the purposes of this meeting) to waive the GE approval rubric only for the purposes of considering for local GE approval those courses which were approved for CSU-GE Breadth during summer 2017?
B. Shall the P\&GE workgroup recommend strengthening the language appearing on page 1 of the catalog to protect the college (and other district colleges) from the publication of honest errors and omissions in the catalog which may affect the ability of students to graduate? What should be the policy if an error is disadvantageous to a student? (Probably needs to apply at the district level and may need to be elevated to DTRW-I) - (see attachment)
C. In the future, shall the P\&GE workgroup allow courses newly approved for CSU-GE Breadth or IGETC to be automatically recommended for addition to the local GE list without further review, excepting courses approved for CSU-GE Breadth area E (Lifelong Learning), and excepting courses which might be recommended for local GE area F (Ethnic/Gender Studies)?

B. Shall MATH V31 be recommended for area D2, using our rubric for approval, effective for AY 2018-19?
C. AES V31, a course we deleted last year, was inadvertently retained on the Pattern II/III GE list in the Ethnic/Gender Studies section of box 2 on page 56 of the 2017-2018 catalog. This will be removed in the next addendum and subsequent catalogs. If a student successfully completed the course in a previous year but wishes to base his/her graduation requirements on this year's catalog, shall such a student be granted GE credit for this course? The counseling department is requesting direction from the curriculum committee.
D. CD V05 appears on the Pattern II/III GE list in the Ethnic/Gender Studies section of box 2 on page 56 of the 2017-2018 catalog, but is not listed in area F (Ethnic/Gender Studies) of the GE list on page 64 of the catalog (aka the "green sheet"). Should this course be removed from the Pattern II/III list, or should it be added to area F?
E. HIST V04B appears and disappears from the GE list in catalogs published over the last several years. Is it the intent of P\&GE/the curriculum committee that this course be on the list? The counseling department is requesting clarification.

CAVEAT-These courses and requirements are subject to change. Students should consult with a Ventura College (VC) counselor and/or visit appropriate websites to receive the most current transfer information.

Completion of the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern is not generally a requirement for transfer to a California State University (CSU) or a University of California (UC) campus, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower division general education (GE) requirements of the CSU or the UC prior to transfer. It is not advisable for all transfer students to follow the IGETC pattern. Some students may be better served by taking courses that fulfill the CSU General Education-Breadth (CSU GE-B) requirements or those of the UC campus or college to which they plan to transfer. Students pursuing majors that require extensive lower division major preparation ("high-unit majors") may not find the IGETC option to be advantageous. Students should also be aware that selected schools and colleges at most undergraduate campuses of the UC have requirements that render the use of IGETC either inappropriate or not permitted (e.g., the College or School of Engineering). The IGETC pattern will probably be most useful for students who want to keep their options open before making a final decision about transferring to a particular CSU or UC campus. For current information, consult the UC Answers for Transfers Booklet.

ADMISSION-Most campuses of CSU and UC only rarely accept transfer applicants at the freshman or sophomore levels. Upper division or advanced standing admission criteria are based on three components:

1) Units-a minimum number of transferable semester units ( 60 to 70 transferable unit for CSU and UC);
2) Scholarship-a minimum cumulative GPA in all transferable coursework (2.0 for CSU; 2.4 for UC; higher for non-California residents); and
3) Subject area requirements-course pattern (a-g) requirements and the ways in which students satisfy these requirements differ between the CSU and the UC. These admission criteria specify only minimum standards. The CSU and/or UC may apply rigorous standards as enrollment demand changes.

All potential transfer students are expected to read the CSU and UC publications for transfers available online or in the Ventura College Counseling Office and Transfer Center.

Applicants must complete both the necessary lower division mathematics and English composition requirements with grades of "C" or better for most campuses by the end of the spring semester prior to transfer in the fall; all Groups of Areas 1 and Area 2 for IGETC. Some campuses require the completion of the English and mathematics requirements by the end of the fall semester prior to transfer in the following fall. Also, some campuses require that the 60 -transferable-unit minimum, the subject area requirements, and major preparation courses with grades of "C" or better be completed by the end of the spring semester prior to transfer in the fall. Completion of the IGETC pattern satisfies lower division GE requirements at all CSUs and most UCs. It does not guarantee eligibility for admission to the CSU or UC system, or to a specific campus or program. Students who are fully certified for IGETC prior to transferring to UC or CSU will satisfy the subject area or course pattern requirements for admission; they must also satisfy the units and scholarship requirements.

USE OF SUMMER COURSEWORK FOR FALL ADMISSION-Only CSU Fullerton considers summer coursework for fall admission, excluding the Golden Four courses (Oral Communication, Written Communication, Critical Thinking, and Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning), and do not accept ADT degrees awarded in Summer for fall admission. CSU Long Beach will consider summer coursework only if a student is completing an Associate Degree for Transfer with a summer graduation date. See calstate.edu/sas/casper/upper-div/admission-registration-and-transcript-receipt.shtml for the latest on restrictions.

CERTIFICATION-All CSU and most UC campuses will accept full certification of the IGETC as meeting all of the lower division GE requirements for the baccalaureate degree. Generally, the last community college a student attends before transferring will determine certification of the IGETC. In addition to the course requirements for each subject area, full certification for the CSU must include completion of the Oral Communication requirement. For the UC, Oral Communication is not required, but full certification must include satisfaction of the Language Other Than English (LOTE) requirement. Consult with a VC counselor to determine the options for satisfaction of the LOTE requirement. Partial certification of IGETC is permitted. A maximum of two IGETC courses may be completed after transfer. NOTE: Partial certification that acknowledges a deficiency in Areas 1 and/or Area 2 may also indicate a student does not meet minimum transfer requirements. Students should make an appointment with a counselor prior to transfer to apply for IGETC certification or to petition for partial certification.

CERTIFIED COURSES-Coursework completed at regionally accredited institutions to include California community colleges (CCCs), along with those colleges and universities which are not CCCs, including out-of-state and independent colleges, may be included among the courses to certify student completion of IGETC if such coursework is comparable to courses on any CCC approved course list. Each CCC course must have been IGETC approved by the time it was taken. In addition, credit awarded for Advanced Placement (AP) exams may be used to meet IGETC requirements. Students should consult with a VC counselor to determine the applicability of coursework and AP exam scores to satisfy the IGETC subject area requirements.

SCHOLARSHIP-Courses used for IGETC certification must be completed with a minimum grade of "C", a grade point of 2.0 on a 4.0 grade scale. ("C-"is not acceptable). A "Pass" ( $P$ ) is acceptable, if it is equivalent to a grade of " C " or higher
at the institution where the course was taken. The UC system allows a maximum of 14 semester units graded Pass/No Pass. Individual CSU campuses also impose unit limitations for Pass/No Pass courses.

COURSE RESTRICTIONS-A single course may count only once; it cannot be used to fulfill GE requirements in two areas simultaneously. The only exception is that the more advanced coursework used to satisfy the UC requirement in Language Other Than English may also be used to satisfy the Humanities requirement. Foreign coursework cannot be applied to IGETC (except Area 6) unless the foreign institution has U.S. regional accreditation.

TRANSFER LIMITATIONS-All transfer limitations applying to courses taken at VC also apply to these general education requirements. Consult a VC counselor concerning these limitations.

TRANSFER COURSES-The approved IGETC course listing designates those courses that may be used to meet university-wide general education requirements (see Certification). The GE courses are not a complete list of all courses that transfer to CSU and UC. Transferability information of courses is found in the Ventura College catalog, the Schedule of Classes (in the online schedule, click the CRN number), the Counseling Office, the Transfer Center, or visit the ASSIST website: assist.org.

ADDITIONAL CSU-GE REQUIREMENTS-Students, who are fully certified under IGETC pattern and transfer to CSU campuses, will be required to complete a minimum of nine units of upper division GE course work and all campus-specific nonGE graduation requirements not completed prior to transfer.
U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION, AND AMERICAN IDEALS REQUIREMENTSAll CSU campuses require students to complete college-level coursework in U.S. History, American Government, and California Government in addition to GE requirements for graduation. Courses completed to satisfy this requirement may be used to satisfy GE requirements for IGETC pattern. UC campuses have similar requirements in American History and Institutions (AH\&I). However, the AH\&I requirements may be satisfied for most UC campuses (except UC Santa Barbara) by completing the subject area requirement in high school. Consult a counselor for further information about this requirement.

MAJOR COURSES-Most campuses require a grade of "C" or better for each course required in preparation for a student's major; most do not allow a "Pass" ( $P$ ) for major courses. Also, The UC will allow IGETC courses to count toward major requirements. Some CSU campuses restrict double counting. To verify which campuses impose restrictions, visit calstate.edu/sas/casper/upper-div/transfer-certification-and-double-counting.shtmI.

MAJOR PREPARATION-Satisfaction of lower division courses required for selected majors is generally required in those majors which are oversubscribed or impacted. The UC and CSU generally prefer students to complete prerequisite major courses before completing general education courses. Of course, all requirements for admission (minimum units, GPA, and subject area requirements) must be completed prior to transfer.

SEQUENTIAL COURSES-Most institutions recommend that students complete sequential courses at the college where the sequence was started. This is especially recommended for a sequence of two or more courses that requires the preceding course(s) as a prerequisite to advancement.

OTHER COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES-Students who plan to attend a private or out-of-state school should consult a counselor and the catalog of the particular school to determine the coursework needed to meet GE requirements at that institution. While most of the courses on the approved IGETC list transfer to other institutions, they do not necessarily satisfy the GE requirements.

TRANSCRIPTS-Students must make a written request of the Admission and Records Office to obtain and/or forward their transcripts. Ventura College sends official transcripts of work completed at this college, Moorpark College, and/or Oxnard College. Students must request transcripts of work completed at any other colleges (outside of the Ventura County Community College District) to be sent to the transfer institution. Your application for certification is not a request for a transcript.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE-Although it is not necessary for a student to complete an associate degree in order to transfer to a four-year school, many of the courses taken to satisfy associate degree requirements are transferable and, in many cases, may be used to meet transfer GE requirements.

TRANSFER ASSISTANCE-The Counselors at Ventura College assist students who encounter problems during or after transfer. Past, present, and future VC students should feel free to contact the Counseling Office or the Transfer Center at Ventura College at any time.

# California State University General Education-Breadth 2017-2018 

California law empowers Ventura College (VC) to certify to all campuses of California State University (CSU) that a maximum of 39 of the 48 semester units typically required for general education (GE) for a baccalaureate degree have been completed. The CSU General Education-Breadth (CSU GE-B) pattern requires each student to complete a minimum of 48 semester units. Nine of these units must be upper division level and cannot be taken prior to the term in which upper division status (completion of 60 semester units) is attained. These minimum nine of the 48 units must be earned at the campus granting the baccalaureate degree. The 48 -unit total of GE courses is a minimum; some campuses of the CSU system may elect to exceed this minimum in their general education-breadth requirements. The 39 semester units for the lower division general educationbreadth requirements are specified in a GE Area according to the pattern listed on the CSU GE-B approved course list.

CAVEAT-These courses and requirements are subject to change. Students should consult with a VC counselor and appropriate websites (e.g., http://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/transfer/
or https://www2.calstate.edu/apply/transfer ) to receive the most current transfer information.

ADMISSION—Students are not assured of admission to the campus and/or major of first choice. Consult your counselor for further information. Completion of GE requirements is not required for admission to a CSU campus. A student who is planning to transfer to one of the campuses of the CSU (except the Maritime Academy) can qualify for admission by meeting the following requirements:

1) Lower division transfers-the CSU, with few exceptions, will no longer accept lower division transfer students;
2) Upper division transfers-upper division transfers may qualify for admission if they have completed $\mathbf{6 0}$ or more transferable semester units (maximum 70 units) and have completed the appropriate college courses with a grade of " C " or better to satisfy subject area requirements. Applicants must have a $\mathbf{2 . 0}$ overall grade point average on a 4.0 grade scale in all transferable college units completed ( 2.4 for nonCalifornia residents) and be in good standing at the last college or university attended; continuous attendance is not required.
3) Subject area requirements-this admission requirement can be satisfied by completing 30 semester units of general education courses with a grade of "C" or better in each course, to include English Language Communication, Critical Thinking (all groups of Area A), and Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning (Area B4).

USE OF SUMMER COURSEWORK FOR FALL ADMISSION-Only CSU Fullerton considers summer coursework for fall admission, excluding the Golden Four courses (Oral Communication, Written Communication, Critical Thinking, and Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning), and do not accept ADT degrees awarded in Summer for fall admission. CSU Long Beach will consider summer coursework if a student is complete an Associate Degree for Transfer with a summer graduation date. See calstate.edu/sas/casper/upper-div/admission-registration-and-transcriptreceipt.shtml for the latest on restrictions.

FULL CERTIFICATION-Completion of all five Areas or sections of these requirements prior to transferring will permit Ventura College to certify to each of the CSU campuses listed below that a student has fulfilled the CSU GE-Breadth requirement. Each of the campuses of CSU requires an additional nine units of upper division GE work in residence; some campuses may require more than the 48-unit minimum. Students should make an appointment with a VC counselor prior to transfer to apply for CSU GE-Breadth certification.

SUBJECT AREA CERTIFICATION-It is possible to complete separately any of the Areas or sections (A-E) at VC and receive partial certification in any or several of these GE areas; if a student is not fully certified, it will be necessary to complete the remaining areas (and perhaps other areas) after transferring, as defined in the catalog of the transfer school.

CERTIFIED COURSES-Ventura College will also certify courses completed at other California community colleges (CCC) or CSU campuses in partial satisfaction of GE requirements provided that such courses are at the baccalaureate level and would be certified in a GE Area by the institution offering them. Students who have completed courses at other colleges and universities should consult with a VC Counselor regarding "pass-along" certification.

SCHOLARSHIP—Most campuses require a grade of " C " or better for most courses and an overall " $C$ " average ( 2.0 GPA ) for all courses used to satisfy GE requirements. For further information, visit the website: http://www.calstate.edu/sas/casper/upper-div/index.shtml

COURSE RESTRICTIONS-Some CSU campuses restrict double counting. To verify which campuses impose restrictions, go to http://www.calstate.edu/sas/casper/upper-div/transfer-certification-and-doublecounting.shtml

TRANSFER COURSES-The list of the approved CSU GE-Breadth courses specifies those GE courses that are used to meet GE requirements. It is not a complete list of CSU transferable courses in majors or elective transfer. Transferability of courses information is found in the VC Catalog, the Schedule of Classes (in the online schedule, click the CRN number), the Counseling Office, the Transfer Center, and/or visit the ASSIST website: assist.org.
U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION, AND AMERICAN IDEALS REQUIREMENTSAll CSU campuses require students to complete college-level coursework in U.S. History, American Government, and California Government in addition to GE requirements for graduation. Courses approved to satisfy this requirement are specified in appropriate areas. All CSU campuses permit double counting of courses taken to meet this requirement and CSU GE-Breadth if the student is partially or fully certified.

MAJOR COURSES-Most campuses require a grade of " C " or better for each course required in preparation for a student's major; most do not allow a "Pass" (P) for major courses. Some CSU campuses allow applicants who submit full or area certifications to double count courses for GE and major requirements. Some majors are highly selective and require completion of some or all of the required major
preparation coursework prior to transfer. Consult with your VC counselor for more information.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE AND SECOND-SEMESTER ENGLISH—Some campuses require foreign language and/or a second semester of English composition for graduation. In some cases, students certified in Areas A and Area C are exempt from these requirements. Also, some campuses require completion of these courses for certain majors. Students should consult the catalog of their campus choice for these requirements.

MULTICULTURALIETHNIC STUDIES REQUIREMENT-CSU campuses require all candidates for the bachelor's degree to complete at least one course in multicultural/ethnic studies as a condition of graduation. Visit the transfer university's catalog or consult with a counselor for further information.

ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS—Students are advised to consult a counselor and/ or the catalog of the state university they plan to attend for requirements unique to that school. Additional courses are required in preparation for a major and/or as electives campuses that may impose additional graduation requirements, other than foreign language and second-semester English composition, are: CSUB, CSUCI, CSUC, CSUEB, CSUFULL, HSU, CSULB, CSULA, CSUMB, CSUN, CSUS, SJSU, CPSLO, SSU, SSU, and CSUSTAN. Visit the transfer university's website or the university's catalog for the most current information.

SEQUENTIAL COURSES-Most institutions recommend that students complete sequential courses at the college where the sequence was started. This is especially recommended for a sequence of two or more courses that requires the preceding course(s) as a prerequisite to advancement.

INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (IGETC)—Students planning to transfer to either a CSU or University of California (UC) campus may elect to use the IGETC pattern in satisfaction of GE requirements. See a VC counselor for additional information or visit http://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/transferl

OTHER COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES-Students who plan to attend one of the campuses of the UC or a private or out-of-state school should consult with a counselor and/or the catalog of the particular school to determine the coursework needed to meet GE requirements at that institution. While many of the courses designated on the CSU GE-Breadth list transfer to UC and other institutions, they do not necessarily satisfy the GE requirements for a particular UC campus. See a VC counselor for information.

TRANSCRIPTS-Students must request transcripts on-line through their MyCCCD Portal or make a written request of the Admission and Records Office to obtain or forward their transcripts. Ventura College sends official transcripts of work completed at this college, Moorpark College, and/or Oxnard College. Students must request transcripts of work completed at any other colleges (outside of the Ventura County Community College District) to be sent to the transfer institution. Your application for certification is not a request for a transcript.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE—Although it is not necessary for a student to complete an associate degree in order to transfer to a four-year university, many of the courses taken to satisfy associate degree requirements are transferable and, in many cases, may be used to satisfy transfer GE requirements.
