Paula noted that she in Student Services, and a longtime Chicano Studies activist. And supports the Chicano Studies degree, but would like to comment on concerns regarding the current version of the program that is being presented at the meeting today.

She was involved in a summit held here at VC that included faculty and community members from all 3 colleges.

Comments brought forth on behalf of the summit committee members on the presented Chicano/a Studies degree:

Spanish courses are included in the degree – they have some concerns. They don't support Spanish being a part of the degree, and feel it is more important to have other Chicano Studies courses instead of Spanish.

Another concern is that the term "Latin-x" is being included, and it is considered a highly controversial term. They feel the Chicano/a Studies degree needs to stay focused on Chicanos and Chicanas.

Q: Do comments address both of the degree patterns, or both?

B. Priority One Report (Discussion; see attachment) – M. Bowen

Annual list of courses published with outlines that have not been updated in the last 5 years or more. There was a copy distributed in the Curriculum Committee meeting packet and was given to all Dept Chairs and Deans.

Just making sure everyone is aware of this. Last year, this list was suspended due to CourseLeaf implementation. Please advise your constituencies that the spring semester is the prime time to prepare new/revised curriculum.

We will continue approving program submissions as well during the spring. Focus of the Priority 1 report are courses.

In the case of courses that have lost information in the CourseLeaf switchover, courses cannot be "fast tracked" (i.e. just DE or textbooks) like we could before due to the lost information. All courses have lost information and cannot be fast tracked without going through an initial regular revision.

Note - Department Chairs should be notified of the no "fast track" issue.

If your course is not on the list, you can still update if needed. A lot was lost in the switch to CourseLeaf, and it would be helpful to check your courses, especially for the upcoming switch to the catalog arm of the CourseLeaf software.

meeting. Rubisela noted that she was not invited to this committee, and no Chicano/a

studies VC faculty were included.

VC Chicano Studies summit was boycotted by the other summit in mentioned in the public

comments.

VC Chicano Studies faculty worked with high school faculty - this has been 3 years in the

making – to align these courses.

There's conflict within the community – and VC Chicano Studies faculty recreated this

program to not have an "us" vs "them" mentality.

VC Faculty has been working together and agree with what has been done with this course

and the program. For Clarification:

Latino - refers to Latin America, Central America

Chicano – areas of Mesoamerica

"X" attached to the terms makes the terms gender neutral, or a "catch all" for those that identify in part with the group, or another group that they feel isn't represented with the other terms.

Spanish courses are an option in the degree, not a requirement.

Most other programs like this are aligned like the program proposed in Part C of this agenda. VC Chicano Studies Faculty also collaborated with other discipline faculty with courses

featured in the program.

Almost all 4 year degrees at the transfer level require a foreign language requirement. It is obvious that Spanish would be included in this degree as an elective for this requirement.

Title including the X is intended to include the new ways of learning about this issue, what students now are facing, and to introduce the idea that the groups are similar and not to exclude in regards to cultural differences.

issues had to be addressed. Created partnerships with local industries. Faculty spoke to employers who'd eventually hire our students to see what they needed to see in a potential employee. Upon looking at our old curriculum, we saw there was an opportunity to restructure what we had to create a program that would allow students to move on.

Stackable credentials and degree.

Q: What level of computer skills are is needed for this program?

A: Student needs to be familiar to navigate programs, save files, sent professional emails,

etc. Basic computer skills definitely needed to navigate programs.

T. Brabander: Would like to revise motion: to have the CC approve these programs and then let the technical review group review these programs further. These have not been through Technical Review yet.

D. Farias: Veterinary Technology – We will be the first to get this program approved. Have a lot of support from local community. Regional Consortia approved this as well. Yay! T. Brabander: Big kudos to Michael Bowen to reviewing these programs – so much time to make sure all of these programs are accurate.

Chicano/a Studies: Suggestion made to change the title to Associate in Arts in Social Justice Studies, Chicano Studies for Transfer Degree to match the TMC. More research will be done to match this. Word version in CourseLeaf is not accurate.

Rubisela would like to keep all courses, and their titles listed as is in the program after the

discussions/public comments today, but agreed to the program title change. First reading Program approvals (XII.C.1) approved for first and second reading.
