¹ Five minutes is allotted to any member of the public who wishes to address the curriculum committee, with a maximum of twenty minutes per topic aggregated for all speakers, unless extended by vote of the committee. At the request of any speaker proposing to address a specific agenda item, the committee may also vote to permit that speaker's comments to be deferred until the meeting progresses to that topic.

At the beginning of the year, there was discussion about the Articulation process. Thao has put together documents/charts (the attachments presented with the agenda).

Questions:

Q: At the P&GE meeting, wasn't there a discussion about wanting a rubric for course removals?

Discussion: Email from Department Chair should be sufficient as notification instead of official rubric. This should be noted in the proposal of the procedure.

At P&GE meeting there was a discussion that there should be approval for a course removal from the GE list from a majority in the department, or the department as the whole so that one person is not making the decision alone to remove the course.

Q: Should we do a signature page for approval?

A: Yes, that sounds great. Would provide "evidence" that department agrees to the removal and can help avoid questions at workgroup or committees, as well as creating a record for posterity.

Recommendation of what the course removal form should look like should be presented at the next P&GE meeting on December 3rd.

Discussion: In the presented documents, the wording is confusing regarding course approval – and when that can happen (found on approval chart, page 20 of the Faculty Guide to Articulation attachment)

Course cannot obtain GE status until it is approved at the Curriculum Committee? Or is it that P&GE can recommend the course for GE before the course is fully approved at the Curriculum Committee – with note of "pending" CC approval? Wording needs to be more clearly presented in the chart.

Q: What is the origin of this document? The counseling department? Past Articulation Officers?

A: Request was made over the summer to have something written down regarding the Articulation procedure. VC doesn't have a written process for Articulation. AO then discussed idea with Curriculum Chair. Original idea was to do 5 or 6 pages as a supplement and it grew into these documents. Since it became so lengthy, the idea was to make this an entirely new document for reference.

Comment: In the appendix E, second page (page 62 of Faculty Guide to Articulation document), "EVP" is noted in the document 3 times, and VC hasn't had an EVP for years. Is this current?

A: This is a draft document, and if errors are found, please note it and email Thao.

Q: Where is this document now?

A:Just coming to the Curriculum Committee for the first time. It has not been presented anywhere else yet.

Q: Is this going to the Academic Senate? Is the Curriculum Committee to approve this?

A: That is the direction we'd like to go, but this is the first time most have seen this and it is still a draft and not ready for voting.

Second attachment (Articulation Guide to Reviewing COR) is information regarding our CORs and what transfer institutions (4 years) are looking for in our CORs. This is not to be in the handbook, this is to be a supplemental document.

VC has major investment in the program already. District office is aware of all of the steps VC has taken up to this point. It is a false equivalency to say that just because MC has animals on campus, their program is VetTech. VetTech does not include exotic/zoological

animals.
