	<ul> <li>Surveys to Concentrate on High Demand Careers —</li> <li>Ernie recommended the Task Force focus on what businesses seek in employees and where the greatest employment demand is.</li> <li>Kay indicated that the Ventura County Workforce Investment Board has created three industry focus groups in the areas of Manufacturing, Clean Green, and Healthcare. The WIB has developed skill-sets needed in each of these areas. Kay recommended finding out how the three areas and skill-sets fit into the program.</li> <li>Stefan indicated that FUSD has a good Agriculture Program where several students matriculate to Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. He would like to see students exposed and informed at the community level. Agriculture courses at the VC Santa Paula site would attract students from FUSD, and is an important industry area for the local community.</li> <li>Jesse recommended the Task Force include the finance, accounting, and a business management side, required for all industry sectors.</li> <li>Lynn recommended that surveys include a list where students can witness examples of jobs and programs of study for each of the industry sectors.</li> <li>Building Rapport with the Community -</li> <li>Perry stated that when the surveys begin, the community will become aware of the program and planning. The Task Force and the College needs to be careful to not make promises which cannot be delivered.</li> <li>Bob restated that the local community pays in taxes for the Measure S Bond on an annual basis but receives nothing in exchange.</li> <li>Perry suggested that a wise move is to restore the Coordinator position at the Ventura College Santa Paula site and maximize the current location as it builds out as a Center.</li> <li>Ernie concurred that VCSP needs to be embraced, and community support should be sought for the current location.</li> <li>Stefan points out the need for a plan to market and expand existing resources to build student participation at VCSP.</li> </ul>	Continue exploring ways to build rapport and maximize the VC Santa Paula site.
