Databases A to Z -- Online Resources

For off-campus access: Simply login to the MyVCCCD portal when prompted

Academic Search Premier (EBSCO) (ASP) Similar to ProQuest Research Library, Academic Search Premier (as compehensive mülö-disciplinary library database that provides access to full-text articles on just about any topic imaginable. ASP contrains access to over Acodo penodicais, including aimost 3300 peer-releved journals, some going back to the mid-1970s or earlier.

access to over 4,600 periodicals, including almost 3,900 peer-reviewed journals, some going back to the mid-1970s or earlier. ACLS Humanities F-Book An online collection of around 5,000 books of high quality in the humanities. These titles are offered by the American Council of Learned Societies in collaboration with thirty-one learned societies, over 100 contributing publishers; and the Michigan Publishing division at the University of Michigan Library

America: History and Life with Full Text The best database to use to cover the history and culture of the United States and Canada, from prehistory to the present. This database indexes over 1,700 journals from 1955 to the present with full text access to more than 200 journals and almost 100 books.

Biography in Context This database combines award-winning biographies along with full-text articles from hundreds of periodicals. Search for people based on one or more personal facts such as birth and death year, nationality, ethnicity, occupation or gender, or combine criteria to create a highly-targeted custom search.

Business Source Elite (EBSCO) This database provides full text access to over 1,000 business publications, with access to some journals going back as far as 1985. Also included within this sources are more than 10,000 company profiles from Datamonitor are also included.

CINAHL Complete 🐡 This database provides subject and keyword searching capabilities to specialized articles from more than 620 nursing & allied health journals. Evidence-based Care Sheets and health-related pamphlets are also included.

Consumer Health Complete (EBSCO) This database is good to use when looking for easy to read and understand health related topics and information. The database provides information from all areas of health and wellness ranging from mainstream medicine to 'complementary, holistic and integrated medicine.' Consumer Health Complete also includes 'the Clinical Reference System and the Lexi-PAL Drug Guide, which provides access to up-to-date, concise and clinically relevant' books about prescription drugs. The library has formed the Streaming Media Ad Hoc Group to explore streaming media databases to add to our offerings. This endeavor will also require the group to determine which database(s) may go up for elimination. The goal is to have a recommendation of which streaming media database would be best to add and which databases may removed from our collection.
