





After you've filed your FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application (CADAA), you will need to follow up with the Financial Aid Office to complete the rest of your requirements.

Students should monitor their portals regularly for updates to financial aid requirements and awards. Log in to <a href="mailto:my.vcccd.edu">my.vcccd.edu</a> and click on the "Financial Aid" tab. From there you can see what you are required to do.

## **SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS**

In order for students to be eligible to receive financial aid, they need to be meeting the Qualitative, Quantitative, and Max Time components of SAP.

Qualitative Standard: A 2.00 minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) in all coursework attempted.

Quantitative Standard: A 67% minimum course completion of all course attempted. Max Time Standard: Attempted units may not exceed 150% of the number of units required to complete your educational objective.



If a student fails to achieve a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA or minimum of 67% completion rate, they will be placed on Warning. If a student is placed on Warning, financial aid is available during that semester. At the end of the Warning semester, a student must have a minimum GPA of 2.00 and must also be completing a minimum of 67% of all attempted units.

### **Financial Aid Suspension:**

If a student does not raise to a 2.00 cumulative GPA and/or bring their completion rate back up to at least 67% at the end of the warning semester, he/she will be Suspended.

During Suspension, a student is not eligible to receive any financial aid other than the California College Promise Grant (formerly Board of Governors Fee Waiver (BOGW), if they qualify. A student can Reinstate their eligibility by completing coursework without financial aid to bring up their GPA and/or completion rate. The student must notify the Financial Aid Office if they Reinstate themselves.



The student can also appeal to receive financial aid during Suspension by completing an appeal through the Financial Aid Office.

#### **Financial Aid Probation:**

If an appeal is approved, the student will be placed on Probation. Students will be required to follow the terms of Probation which will include following an educational plan and completing all attempted units.

Students on Probation can be eligible for financial aid while following the terms/conditions.



# **California College Promise Grant**

College Promise Grant (formerly BOG
Fee Waiver) may lose their eligibility if
they fail to maintain a cumulative GPA
of 2.00 or higher and/or fail to complete more
than 50% of their coursework.
If a student's cumulative GPA falls below
2.00 for two consecutive primary terms
(fall/spring semesters), the student is
placed on academic probation. If the
cumulative number of units completed
is not more than 50%, the student is
placed on progress probation. Any of
the combination of two consecutive
primary terms of academic and/or
progress probation may result in loss

### How to regain eligibility:

eligibility:

If you lose eligibility for the CCPG, there are a few ways that you can have it reinstated:

- Improve your GPA or Course Completion measures to meet the academic and progress standards
- Successfully appeal regarding extenuating circumstances.
- Not attend your school district for two consecutive primary terms

The appeals process for extenuating circumstances includes:

- Verified accidents, illness or other circumstances beyond your control
- Changes in economic situation
- Evidence of inability to obtain essential support services
- Special consideration factors for CalWORKs, EOPS, DSPS, and veteran students
- Disability accommodations not received in a timely manner

The Ventura County Community College District has partnered with Bank Mobile to process financial aid disbursements. The Refund Selection Kit will be mailed to all students who have received a financial aid award other than the California College Promise Grant.

Once you receive your Refund Selection Kit, follow these easy steps:

- 2. Enter your Personal Code
- 3. Select how you'd like to receive your money:


# Cash Course

# Here are some smart money tips to help you succeed financially in college and beyond:

- 1. Create a Spending Plan (aka a Budget): Control your money, don't let money control you! First, list all your sources of income and then all your estimated expenses for the month. Are your total expenses greater than your total income? Look for ways to trim some of your expenses, such as eating out less or borrowing books instead of buying new.
- 2. Build Your Emergency Savings: Life happens—your car may break down or you may have to pay an unexpected visit to the doctor. Emergencies can be a lot less stressful if you have a financial cushion to help. Saving even just a little bit at a time can add up over time. Set an emergency savings goal and use it only when it's needed.
- **3.** Build a Good Credit History: Now is the best time to begin building good credit to help you later when you need it, like to purchase a car. A poor credit history can keep you from getting your dream job or dream home, or even cost you in smaller ways like requiring you to pay a deposit to set up utilities. Build your credit history and improve your credit score by paying bills on time, using credit responsibly and regularly checking your credit history for errors. You can check your credit report for free at www.annualcreditreport.com.
- **4.** Protect Your Identity: Don't let someone else take your money or ruin your credit by stealing your identity. Protect yourself: regularly check your credit history and bank accounts, shred documents you don't need that have personal information, don't share your user IDs/passwords/PIN #s with anyone, don't disclose sensitive information in public and don't respond to suspicious emails or calls. What else can you do to protect yourself?
- **5.** Minimize Debt: Remember, loans and credit card debt must be repaid; use them as a last resort. Apply for as many scholarships and grants as possible. Keep a part-time job if you can without impacting your school work to help with costs. If you must borrow loans or use your credit card, borrow as little as possible and only for needed expenses. Pay debts in full each month if you can. The less debt you have, the more money you will have for other needs or wants later.




