

First student to complete her 2018-2019 financial aid file



The Financial Aid Office has begun processing applications for the **2018-2019** academic year! The priority deadline to complete the FAFSA or California Dream Act application is no later than *March 2, 2018*.

Once the application is received, students are encouraged to complete their files by **May 11, 2018** to prevent major processing delays!!!

* What is CCCG? Community College Completion Grant (CCCG)

The CCCG is a \$1,500 award for Cal Grant and Full-time Student Success Grant recipients. Recipients must be attending at least 15 units per term, and on pace to complete their program of study within the time frame determined in their comprehensive Student Educational Plan (SEP) for the entire length of their program.

* What is a Year-Round Pell Grant?

As of July 1, 2017, Pell-eligible students can receive up to 150% of their scheduled award each year. That includes summer semesters, which may help students in financial need finish their degree sooner. If you are a full-time Pell eligible student in Fall 2017 and Spring 2018 and enroll for Summer 2018, you may qualify. **Important Note:** Your Pell Grant Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU) of 600% will be affected if you decide to receive up to 150% of your scheduled award.

For example, a student with a zero Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is eligible for \$5,920 in Pell Grant for the year, or \$2,960 for the fall semester and \$2,960 for the spring semester (based on full-time enrollment for both semesters). Now, a student can receive an additional \$2,960 disbursement if they enroll full-time (12 units) for summer or up to a maximum of \$8,880 for the entire academic year.

* What is the California College Promise Grant (CCPG)?

The Board of Governors of the California Community College system offers a fee waiver program for low-income residents of California who are attending a community college. The California College Promise Grant (formerly known as Board of Governors (BOG) fee waiver) will waive all per-unit enrollment fees for an eligible student. It will also waive a portion of parking permit fees. To qualify for a California College Promise Grant, you need to be classified as a resident of California or AB 540 student, according to Admissions and Records.

What is CalFresh?

The CalFresh program, formerly known as Food Stamps and federally known as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), can add to your food budget to put healthy and nutritious food on the table.

Eligibility

In order to be eligible for CalFresh as a student, you must be between the ages of 18 and 49, enrolled in at least 6 units, have no meal plan (or have a meal plan that provides ten or less of your meals per week) and meet any ONE of the requirements listed at www.venturacollege.edu/calfresh.
