Working in programs that serve children and/or families can be a personally rewarding and satisfying career, and when well done in high-quality programs, this work contributes to the healthy growth of children and families.



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
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SET YOUR COURSE



CHILD DEVELOPMENT

The Child Development program provides a foundation for early childhood teacher preparation as well as preparation for working with children and families in various venues. Students may complete coursework for a Certificate of Achievement in Child Development which includes introductory studies in child development, early childhood curriculum and pedagogy, and student teaching experiences at the Orfalea Child Development Center at Ventura College.

Students may complete courses for two types of associate of science degrees. The A.S. degree in Child Development includes the child development courses that are required for the Certificate of Achievement in Child Development plus an array of general education classes. The A.S. degree in Early Childhood Education (ECE) for Transfer provides a clearly articulated curricular track for students who wish to transfer to a California State University.

OUR PROGRAM

The Child Development Program at Ventura College provides students with the knowledge, skills and dispositions to be employed in local private- and state-funded childcare programs and community agencies while also preparing them for transfer to a CSU. Students learn about the California Early Learning System from the CA Department of Education while developing a strong understanding of ages and stages of child development and a variety of theories about how people grow and change over time. Many of the child development courses provide students with opportunities to observe live classrooms of children and to apply the content of the courses through hands-on experiences. Topics include an introduction to the profession, observation techniques, age-appropriate curriculum, the child in the context of family and culture, and health and safety practices for early childhood education.
