
PARAMEDIC THEORY

The course focuses on the didactic material and related skills necessary to establish a foundation for Prehospital **PARAMEDIC FIELD INTERNSHIP** assessment and management of patients. Class meets four days each week (28.5 hours weekly).

PARAMEDIC **CLINICAL LABORATORY**

The hospital rotation provides the paramedic student with supervised clinical application of cognitive knowledge and skills in acute patient hospitals and multiple departments during their 40 hour per week clinical rotations.

The student is assigned to one of Ventura County's paramedic providers on an emergency response unit, either ambulance or fire apparatus based.
