# A. Faculty training before granting access to CurricUNET (Action) – M. Pauley

Mark P. stated that the Tech Review Committee has created a procedure to grant faculty access to CurricuNET:

- 1) Have part-time faculty request access through their Department Chairs;
- 2) The Department Chair will send an email request to Nan Duangpun for part-time and/or new full-time faculty to have access to CurricUNET;
- 3) Nan D. will provide training and access information to the faculty as requested.

### B. Charges of District Committees (Information) – M. Pauley

Mark P. explained the charges of the DCAA and DTRW-I committees and the flow of the curriculum approval process. Ramiro S. also added that some of the same members serving on DCAA would also serve on DTRW-I.

### C. TMC Degrees (Information) – M. Pauley

Mark P. presented information on the number of students who have applied to the CSU system with a transfer degree for the Spring 2013 semester. Angelica G. also stated that students can submit their application even though they have not yet completed their transfer degree. Ventura College is ranked in the top 5 in the State as one of the community colleges with a high number of transfer degrees available.
