

VENTURA COLLEGE SCHOOL OF NURSING APPLICATION PACKET

The requirements, procedures, application dates, and program offerings for all Health Science programs are <u>subject to change</u>. It is the responsibility of each student to seek current information. Students interested in a nursing career should register to attend a pre-nursing workshop by calling the Ventura College Counseling Office at (805) 289-6448. <u>After attending a workshop</u>, interested students should schedule an appointment as soon as possible with a <u>nursing counselor</u>. ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE - NURSING

Students receive an Associate in Science Degree with a major in Nursing (ADN) upon completion of this program and become eligible to take the state examination leading to licensure as a registered nurse (RN). Students who choose not to complete the degree requirements are eligible to take the licensing examination after completion of content required for licensure. Please see a nursing counselor or the Director of the School of Nursing for information regarding this option.

Procedures for Applying

Applications are accepted twice yearly. Admission is subject to meeting the eligibility requirements and available openings. The Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program is impacted and has a waiting list. Application deadlines for Application Packet are as follows:

For Spring admission: Apply: August 1through September 15

October 1: TEAS examination results to School of Nursing

For Fall admission: Apply: February 1 through March 15

April 1: TEAS examination results to School of Nursing

Counseling appointments must be scheduled to submit the nursing application. Students must complete the nursing application appointment Pre-Screening form to get cleared to schedule an appointment. All required official transcripts from every regionally accredited academic institution attended since high school, regardless of the type of courses in which student was enrolled or completed must be on file with the Admissions and Records Office. Transcripts from Ventura, Moorpark, or Oxnard College are not required.

If the due dates fall on a weekend or holiday the application will be accepted by 5:00 PM on the next business day. **The application and TEAS results** must be submitted by the above stated deadlines. Failure to do so will result in removal of your name from the applicant pool. You must see a nursing counselor and reapply.

All applicants must submit the following to a nursing counselor:

- 1. Application to the ADN program (application is available to download and print online from the Nursing Science webpage)
- 2. Proof of <u>current</u> California certification as a nursing assistant by the California Department of Public Health upon application.
 - a. Active certification is recommended to be maintained through the semester you are entering.
- 3. Multi criteria screening supporting documentation form completed
 - a. Documentation of advanced degrees, diplomas or relevant certificates
 - b. Documentation of proficiency in another language
 - c. Documentation of Work or Volunteer Experience in Healthcare
 - d. Documentation of Life Experiences or Special Circumstances

Applicants must submit TEAS examination results to the School of Nursing by October 1 for September 15 application deadline and April 1 for March 15 application deadline.

Names of academically eligible students will be sent to the School of Nursing for processing. Please expect a 2-3 month wait from TEAS deadlines to receive waiting list status. If you have any address or telephone number changes please come into the Health Science office and complete a change form.

Associate Degree Curriculum

The associate degree program in nursing is intended to develop the necessary knowledge and skills basic to the functions of registered nurses in the direct care of clients. Many of the courses assigned to this curriculum are transfer courses and articulation is possible with the baccalaureate programs in nursing at the California State University campuses. The courses may be applied as a foundation for advanced work at the discretion of the accepting institution. Courses are taken on campus concurrently with supervised clinical experience in selected hospitals and agencies. constituting a nursing science practicum or laboratory experience. Although each course merits a letter grade, the laboratory experience is based on pass-fail and it is necessary to pass the laboratory section of the course in order to proceed in nursing. Failure in the laboratory portion of a nursing course constitutes an F in the course. For successful completion of the program, a minimum grade of C is mandatory in all courses required for the nursing major. These include courses outside the discipline of nursing but required for the major, such as anatomy, microbiology, etc. Although a "C" is acceptable in one of the biological science courses, the overall science GPA must be 2.5 or higher with no more than one withdrawal, D or F in either anatomy, physiology or microbiology. In addition, the student must maintain an overall GPA ≥ 2.5 to be admitted. If the student has a GPA of < 2.5 or more than one W, D or F in a science course, he/she must see a nursing counselor to develop a remediation plan. (If the student does not meet the state minimum requirements for overall GPA, Science GPA, science repeats and/or TEAS success score, he or she must see a nursing counselor regarding remediation) The student must

maintain an overall GPA \geq 2.0 to continue in the nursing program. The student is not eligible for admission into the nursing program until remediation is successfully completed. A new application must be submitted at this time. Please schedule a counseling appointment to submit a new application.

Courses are taken on campus concurrent with supervised clinical laboratory experience in selected hospitals and agencies which serve as extended campus sites. Each student is responsible for his/her own transportation to the extended campus sites, some of which are a distance from the College.

The nursing program is approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing. To be eligible to take the NCLEX-RN examination leading to licensure as a registered nurse, the student must have fulfilled all requirements as defined by the California State Board of Registered Nursing. Students who choose not to complete the degree requirements are eligible to take the NCLEX-RN licensing examination after completion of content required for licensure. Please be advised that not all states recognize registered nurses who choose this option. Please contact the ADN program director for additional information.

Background Checks / Drug & Alcohol Screening

PLEASE BE AWARE THAT CONVICTION OF A FELONY MAY PROHIBIT YOU FROM BEING LICENSED AS A REGISTERED NURSE. EACH CASE IS REVIEWED AND ADJUDICATED BY THE BOARD OF REGISTERED NURSING. THE BOARD CONSIDERS THE NATURE AND SEVERITY OF THE OFFENSE, ADDITIONAL SUBSEQUENT ACTS, RECENCY OF ACTS OR CRIMES, COMPLIANCE WITH SANCTIONS, AND EVIDENCE OF REHABILITATION. FOR FURTHER INFORMATION, CONTACT THE PROGRAM DIRECTOR IN THE SCHOOL OF NURSING OR A NURSING COUNSELOR. CONTACT WITH THE BOARD OF REGISTERED NURSING TO DISCUSS PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS MAY BE INITIATED BEFORE ENTRY INTO THE PROGRAM AND THIS WILL BE RECOMMENDED IN CERTAIN CASES.

Students in the nursing program are required to undergo criminal background checks prior to participating in clinical experiences. The cost of a background check is approximately \$60.00 and must be borne by the student. Background checks for admission to the nursing program involve a seven year search. Misdemeanors and / or felonies within the previous seven years (including DUIs) will result in a student's inability to be assigned to a clinical agency for patient care experiences. This will necessitate dismissal from the program.

Applicants will be required to pass drug and alcohol screening prior to entering the nursing program. This is a requirement of the clinical agency partners. Students with a positive drug or alcohol screen will be immediately disqualified for admission. Students already enrolled will be required to pass a drug and alcohol screening to progress in the program. Costs for this testing must be borne by the student and currently are approximately \$50.00. Fees for immunization tracking may be required.

Qualifying Requirements

SCIENCE REQUIREMENTS: Effective Fall 2005 and thereafter, the combined anatomy & physiology course no longer meets entrance requirements for the nursing program. If the combined course was completed prior to Fall 2005, it will be accepted for admission. All entering students will be required to have a minimum overall college GPA \geq 2.50 and an overall biological science GPA \geq 2.50 (anatomy, physiology, microbiology) with no more than one withdrawal, D or F in ANY of these three (3) courses.

TEAS EXAM: Students must attain the required "success score" (currently ≥ 62%) on the TEAS V or ATI TEAS exam after submitting an application for admission to the nursing program, that is by April 1 for the March 15 application deadline, and by October 1 for the September 15 application deadline. Students may apply to the nursing program before TEAS testing is completed but must submit verification of having met the success score on the State designated assessment examination (currently the ATI TEAS) to the School of Nursing by the TEAS deadline. Students who do not meet the mandated success score must schedule an appointment with a nursing counselor to discuss remediation and retesting requirements. The success score for the TEAS exam is subject to change based on the State Chancellor's requirements. Applicants must meet the success score on the first attempt or must remediate. If remediation is needed, the student must reapply to the nursing program after successful remediation. Results of testing at other sites are accepted when forwarded directly to Ventura College School of Nursing by the testing Tests completed at other sites are counted as testing attempts. Accommodations for testing may be available to students with disabilities. Applicants must notify the nursing program director and obtain Education Assessment Center (EAC) authorization prior to scheduling a TEAS exam if accommodations are required. (Please see additional information below for TEAS requirements.) Scores for the TEAS V version will be accepted and counted (if this version was taken more than once). Effective for the application period of August 1 to September 15, 2021 TEAS V will no longer be accepted. Only ATI TEAS will be accepted and counted.

CNA REQUIREMENT: Applicants must have current California certification as a nursing assistant (CNA) at the time the application is submitted. Active certification is recommended to be maintained through the semester you are entering, but is not required. Certification is provided by the California Department of Public Health.

SOCIAL SECURITY CARD: Applicants must have a valid Social Security number and will be required to submit the original card.

- 1. One of the following must be completed **BEFORE** applying to the program:
 - a. A minimum of 12 semester units of completed college coursework with a ≥2.5 GPA or

- b. Equivalent consistent with Board of Registered Nursing requirement (see nursing counselor for details).
- 2. All of the following must be completed:
 - a. An application to the college must be filed for the appropriate semester.
 - b. All college transcripts must be on file at Ventura College before submitting the nursing application. It is the applicant's responsibility to check with the transcript clerk in the Office Admissions and Records to see that his / her official transcripts are on file at Ventura College.
 - c. Application to the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program must be submitted to the nursing counselor by appointment only at Ventura College by September 15 or March 15 to be considered.
- 3. All of the following must be **COMPLETED** before applying to the program:* These Ventura College courses, listed with the comparable courses from Moorpark (MC) and Oxnard (OC) Colleges are:
 - a. <u>Math:</u> completion of a college intermediate algebra course with a minimum grade of C: MATH V03 or V03E, Math V12, Math 13B or MATH V35. (MATH M03 or M03B or M04B MC; R014 OC). As of Fall 2009 **Math requirements** for the associate degree have changed. Please see a nursing counselor for details on these changes.
 - b. <u>Chemistry:</u> one year of high school with a C or better (official high school transcripts required) <u>OR</u> one semester of college chemistry with laboratory, with a minimum grade of C: CHEM V20 and V20L, or CHEM V30 and V30L or higher level (CHEM M11 or M12 MC; CHEM R104, or CHEM R110 OC).
 - c. <u>Anatomy:</u> college anatomy, 4 semester unit course with laboratory, with a minimum grade of C: ANAT V01 (ANAT M01 MC; ANAT R101 OC)
 - d. <u>Physiology:</u> college physiology, 4 semester unit course with lab with a minimum grade of C: PHSO V01. (PHSO M01 MC; PHSO R101 OC).
 - e. <u>Microbiology</u>: college bacteriology/microbiology 4 semester unit course with laboratory, with a minimum grade of C: MICR V01. (MICR M01 MC; MICR R100 and R100L OC).
 - f. <u>CNA: current certification as a nursing assistant (CNA)</u> in the State of California or equivalent.

*The math/science faculty strongly recommend that these courses, especially anatomy, physiology and microbiology, be completed during separate terms. A large number of students who have attempted two or more of these classes in a single term, particularly if they have been working while enrolled in college, have experienced serious academic difficulty.

Students must be in good academic standing (not on academic probation) to be eligible for application to the nursing program at Ventura College. All applicants must contact the nursing counselor for specific admission information regarding the nursing program.

- 4. Additional courses required for those enrolled in the ADN program are listed below. With the exception of human development, students may complete these additional courses before or after acceptance into the nursing program. The School of Nursing recommends that students complete as many courses as possible before acceptance as scheduling may be a major problem once admitted to the program. Completion of these courses after completion of the nursing program delays the licensure examination. Students who delay taking the licensure examination have a significantly higher risk of not passing it. These Ventura College courses, listed with the comparable courses from Moorpark (MC) and Oxnard (OC) Colleges, are:
 - a. Growth & development across the lifespan: CDV 03 or PSY V05 (PSY M07 - MC; Psy R108 [Developmental Psychology] - OC)
 - b. ENGL V01A (ENGL V02 or V03 not acceptable); (ENGL M01A or M01AH MC; ENGL R101 OC)
 - c. PSY V01 (PSY M01 MC; PSY R101 OC)
 - d. ANTH V02 or SOC V01 or V02 or V03 OR AES V11 (ANTH M02 or SOC M01, M02, M08 - MC; ANTH R102 or SOC R101, R102, R103 - OC)
 - e. COMM V01(Introduction to Speech) or V10 (COMM M01 or M02 or M07 MC; COMM R101 OC).

Additional courses required by Ventura College for the AS degree are:

- a. Humanities 6 units
 1 course in Fine or Performing Arts (see AA/AS Check Sheet)
 1 Humanities elective (see AA/AS Check Sheet)
- b. Physical Education / Health Education 2 courses (NS V40 fulfills one Health Education requirement for nursing majors only.)
- c. American History and Institutions 1 course (see AA/AS Check Sheet)

Competency Requirements:

- a. Reading satisfactory completion of degree requirements
- b. Written expression satisfactory completion of ENGL V01A
- c. Mathematics satisfactory completion of MATH V35, MATH V03 or MATH V03A V03E, Math V12, or V13B

Admission Process

Each <u>qualified</u> applicant will be assigned a number by the use of random drawings. The class will be selected on the basis of available openings in the order determined by the student's ranking on the multi screening criteria (75% of the entering class) and the random numbers assigned to each applicant in each applicant pool (25% of the entering class). Each <u>qualified</u> applicant, when selected, must decide to enter the class, remove his or her name from the eligibility list, or request a deferment. <u>Applicants may defer entry one time only. The following semester entry is not guaranteed.</u> Those qualified applicants who are not selected due to limited openings may retain their names (in the order assigned by a random drawing) on a waiting list. These applicants then have priority for admission to 25% of the next class selected. <u>Students who choose not to enter (second deferment) when selected after a deferment must reapply as a new student and receive a new random number assignment and must meet all current requirements.</u>

Multi-Criteria Screening

The School of Nursing will admit a minimum of 75% of students based on enhanced admission criteria.

- 1. All students will be added to an existing wait list.
- 2. The School of Nursing will screen and rank order all students on the wait list based on a multi-criteria screening.
- 3. 75% of the entering class will be based on the students with the highest scores from the multi-criteria ranking. These students will be admitted **FIRST** to the nursing program.
- 4. 25% of the entering class will be admitted based on their position on the wait list.

Enhanced criteria will include: GPA in science courses, repeats on science courses (anatomy, physiology and microbiology), academic degrees, diplomas, or relevant certificates held by an applicant; relevant work or volunteer experience, life experiences or special circumstances of the applicant, including but not necessarily limited to the following - disabilities, low family income, first generation of family to attend college, need to work, disadvantaged social or educational environment, difficult personal and family situations or circumstances, refugee or veterans status, proficiency or advanced level course work in languages other than English and assessment / readiness test results (TEAS scores). In each of the science courses, the FIRST passing grade is the one used to calculate the science GPA, even if the course was repeated and a higher grade earned.

After students have been selected by the above procedure, a physical exam must be passed prior to entry into the program. This exam must be consistent with the policies of the teaching hospitals

or agencies to which they are assigned for clinical experience. Physical exams may be scheduled with a private physician or through the Student Health and Psychological Services utilizing the forms provided by the School of Nursing. The examination must demonstrate that the student is physically fit, free from communicable diseases and immune to rubella, rubeola, mumps, varicella and hepatitis. Current tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis (Tdap), and influenza vaccination is required. The health care provider must verify that the student is able to participate in the nursing program without physical restrictions. Tuberculosis (TB) clearance must be submitted by the posted deadline each semester to progress in the nursing program and may not expire during the semester. Two-step TB testing or QuantiFERON blood test is required.

All students admitted to a health science program are expected to maintain the highest personal standards for conduct consistent with the professional standards as perceived by the School of Nursing faculty and professional personnel in the agencies used as extended campus sites. Any information indicating that such standards are not maintained is subject to review by members of the School of Nursing faculty and may result in a recommendation to the College for dismissal from the program. Evidence of physical and emotional fitness upon admission and throughout the program is expected and is subject to medical opinion or policy of hospitals or agencies that are used as extended campus sites for assigned educational experience. Students should refer to the Technical Standards outlined in the School of Nursing Student Handbook for details. Current CPR certification for basic life support provider or basic life support for healthcare provider is an additional requirement and must be submitted each semester by the posted deadline to progress in the nursing program. Online CPR courses do not fulfill this requirement. Certification may not expire during the semester.

Career Ladders, Transfer and Advanced Placement

Transfer students may be accepted as space permits and credit for nursing courses taken at other institutions will be evaluated on an individual basis. The School of Nursing also provides opportunities for licensed vocational nurses (LVNs) to advance on the career ladder with vertical mobility providing education leading to eligibility for registered nurse licensure. To be eligible for this program, a candidate must be an LVN who is currently licensed in California. Interested candidates should contact a nursing counselor for transfer / challenge requirements and an application.

To be eligible for the 30-unit option program, a student must be a vocational nurse who is licensed to practice in California. Interested candidates should contact a nursing counselor for an individual evaluation of eligibility. Individuals who become licensed as registered nurses using this option may not be eligible for licensure in states other than California. Students pursuing this option must complete NS V31 and NS V41 instead of NS V30 and NS V40. All entries into career ladder programs are on a space available basis. Applicants must complete PHSO V01 and Micro V01 only with minimum grades of "C" in each course. Applicants must meet the overall and science GPA \geq 2.5 and TEAS requirements for entry. However, applicants for the 30 unit option are only required to have a current LVN license in the state of California; they are not required to complete the TEAS test or meet any additional requirements for entry.

NURSING APPLICATION: ADN (Associate Degree Nursing)

Procedures for Applying:

All ADN applicants must schedule an appointment with a nursing counselor, complete this nursing application and submit it to a nursing counselor by September 15 or by March 15 for the random draws. It is the applicant's responsibility to see that official transcripts of ALL previous high school and college work (not including Moorpark and Oxnard College transcripts) are received by the Office of Admissions & Records prior to scheduling an appointment to apply to the nursing program.

In addition, nursing applicants must also file: (1) <u>an Application for Admission</u> to Ventura College (new students only). Requirements for all Health Science programs are stated in the Ventura College Catalog.

Applicants should be aware that the Associate Degree Nursing program is impacted. As a result, there are more qualified applicants than can be admitted to this program each semester. Candidates will be selected through the use of multi-criteria screening and random number assignments from those applicants who have satisfied entry requirements. Names of qualified applicants will be placed on a <u>waiting list</u> for entry in subsequent semesters.

COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS <u>must be met</u> in the following areas: Reading, Written Expression and Mathematics major requirements for transfer students in this field and related disciplines differ from associate degree requirements. If you plan to transfer, consult your counselor.

HIGHLY RECOMMENDED COURSES: Although not required, it is strongly recommended that the following courses be taken prior to admission into the ADN program. NS V07, Pharmacology (3 units); MATH V35, Intermediate Algebra for Health Care Professional (4 units – meets math competency requirements for the associate degree.); BUS V27A, Beginning Medical Terminology, Pathophysiology.

While enrolled in NS V10 and NS V20, it is strongly recommended that students also enroll in NS V84A and NS V84B (Success in High-Risk Nursing Courses) to enhance their potential for success in these courses.

EXPLANATION OF MULTI-CRITERIA REQUIREMENTS

<u>Failure to submit transcripts with all grades posted will result in disqualification.</u> Official transcripts (in original sealed/unopened envelope) for all lower and upper division courses completed at any and all regionally accredited U.S. institutions, regardless of applicability to nursing requirements is required. Unofficial transcripts are acceptable for courses at Moorpark College, Ventura College and Oxnard College. Documentation will have already been turned in to counselors prior to application for verification.

Prerequisite courses completed at other regionally accredited United States colleges or universities must be equivalent to Ventura College courses. For determination of course equivalency, official transcripts AND course descriptions for prerequisite courses will be required. All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better and the final grade must be posted to the transcript. Course descriptions for prerequisite courses only must accompany the academic transcript for the purpose of determining course equivalency. CRITERIA 2: TEAS EXAM:

Students who take the TEAS exam at Ventura College do not have to submit any documentation of the test. Your results will be on file. Students who took the Teas exam at any other location must go to www.atitesting.com online store and request that your official TEAS results be sent to Ventura College. The TEAS exam may only be taken two times including attempts at any other institution. If the minimum score was not achieved on the first attempt, the composite and subset scores on the second attempt will be used as the valid TEAS composite score. For those that remediate an unsuccessful TEAS composite score, results of all TEAS attempts must be made available through ATItesting.com to the School of Nursing.

MAXIMUM POINTS = 30

Total maximum points earned come from the sum of the points awarded for the student's TEAS composite score, English score, Reading score, Math score and Science score.

For those students required to take ATI TEAS the cut composite score is 62%. By fall 2016 ADMISSIONS, all new cohorts will be required to take the new ATI TEAS. If you have not taken the TEAS V by August 31, 2016, you MUST take ATI TEAS. If the TEAS composite score is below 62% the student is not eligible for admission.
