### II. Discussion/Information

## A. Honors Courses (Discussion)

8 courses in development

How do we technically review these courses? What will honors courses look like at VC?

Peter and Maline to meet with the Honors Courses workgroup. So far have had scheduling conflicts. Will meet and report back to Committee when a more established plan is completed.

# B. Open Entry/Open Exit Courses (Discussion)

How should we offer these courses at VC? How should they be handled at Technical Review Handout (link in item B) bullet points mentioned.

Supervised Tutoring IDS N100 - currently at VC is OEOE.

ATEB courses are OEOE when they were being offered (noncredit courses).

MATH faculty is looking to add some OEOE opportunities

OEOE = a student can come in at any time during the semester, complete all learning objectives and can leave the course at any time before the end of the semester

Common Practice to list OEOE in the catalog? How are we signaling that a course is available for OEOE? Do we need to memorialize OEOE on the COR? Stipulations regarding DE modality? Do we require any indication in the COR as to how the student can move through the course? Should we require them to be positive attendance or should that be case by case?

Would be beneficial to be transparent and up front with students and include it in COR

Course Content section – boilerplate statement could be created to be used on OEOE courses. Would this be specific course to course, or made for all courses? Depends on the way the course is being rolled out/instructors provide information.

If a course is set up as OEOE, how does registration work?

#### Discussion conclusions:

Boilerplate language was agreed to be a good idea for the catalog description – to be placed in "additional catalog notes" section

Modalities should be all inclusive – allow 100% face to face as well as all DE modality options

Peter and Maline to come up with boilerplate language and will bring it to the next CC meeting for further discussion.

Due to time, discussion stopped to talk about remaining items.

#### C. Bachelors Degrees at Ventura College (Discussion)

Maline shared PowerPoint from CTE Division

F. Duenas: 2021 – Statewide, AB 927 authorized Community Colleges can offer baccalaureate degree programs. Max of 30 programs annually. 25% of a college's courses can be upper division.

State has 2 cycles annually, the second cycle of application process is due in Jan. ACE Dept would like to submit for a baccalaureate program that builds on existing ACE program – providing additional education for students already technicians in the field – additional opportunities for higher education to be able to move up.

LMI shows there is a demand for jobs we are targeting in our region.

Baccalaureate degree would apply to only those accepted to the program.

There has been pushback from CSUs. But the State seems to approve programs anyway if the CSU does not offer the same program.

These programs are designed to be degrees that the 4-year universities don't offer, and to be offered at a lower cost. Units would be a little more expensive than a 2-year degree unit, but it would be less than \$10K to complete bachelor's degree.

ACE department, with support, can apply to the January window and possibly see this program live in Fall 2025.

### BA Degree Pilot Program Handbook

Peter and Maline to come up with a resolution to include the Curriculum Committee's approval of these programs as a concept. PowerPoint attached above in link and will be included on the next CC agenda as an informational item.

#### D. Classified Voting Member on Curriculum Committee (Discussion)

Discussion: This is long overdue, select classified members at VC are very involved in Curriculum, have a great deal of knowledge on curriculum topics, and should have voting rights. There are classified individuals at other colleges in the state (as evidence at the Curriculum Institute) that are voting members on their Curriculum Committees.

OC has a classified member that has voting privileges. Would not be a new concept even for this District. Classified brings knowledge to the table.

Discussion point brought up that only voting members can be chairs of the committee - as a consideration, there would have to be clarification regarding this if a classified professional is a voting member.

An idea presented that the Classified voting member can rotate rather than it be just one position. Should be someone closely related to Curriculum – i.e. Curriculum Specialist, Academic Data Specialist, DE Liaison

If the Curriculum Committee would like to proceed with a recommendation to make this happen. the recommendation would have to be made to Senate - the Curriculum Committee can't decide on its own. The recommendation would then need a "Vote of the Senate of the Whole" and that generally happens during All College Day(s).
