California State University Channel Islands-	 Pareference Slide Show 2021 - 66 graduates 70 test takers (4 from 2020) All passed on first attempt Pass rate of 94.3% 2022 - 72 graduates Spring Applications Goleta - 230 (22 admitted) Camarillo - 970 (48 admitted) High demand for nursing programs, partners are experiencing nursing shortages, ability to admit is based on clinical capacity Attrition rate is around 3% RN to BSN Program Partnering with 6 community colleges 2022 admitted 31 students ADN to BSN admissions are down statewide This year about 50% of applicants already had RN license, previously mainly ADN transfer students December 2021 - 16 graduates May 2022 - 18 graduates May 2022 - 18 graduates August 2022 - 2 graduates MSN Program Launched in Fall 2020 amid COVID Struggling with FNT clinical placements 90% of students on track to graduate CCNE Accreditation Visit expected by the end of May Site visit in September produced report with no recommendations BRN approval visit at end of September May 2022 - 14 graduates, 3 postmasters FNP certificate students, 12 FNP, 2 nurse educators Could use more FNP placements,

- ADN Program Enrollments
 - o Fall 2021 30
 - o Spring 2022 36
 - Applications up from pre-pandemic times by 20%, approximately 400 applicants each semester
 - Admissions down by 10% due to COVID limitations
 - Current struggle is pediatric placements
 - Attrition rate has increased related to family needs, career choice changes, excused withdrawals
- Admissions are a combination of multi criteria and random selection
- Demographics similar to surrounding area
- Grants supporting the program
 - o Nursing Program Support
 - Strong Workforce
- Retention by course
 - o By course Fall 2021 good overall
 - o Overall benchmark recently updated due to ACEN Accreditation
 - Previously 80%
 - Updated to 70%
- Graduation Statistics
 - o 67 potential graduates
 - o 33 in May 2022
 - Will be fewer for 22-23 due to smaller upcoming classes
- Retention Strategies
 - Dedicated mental health counselor that focuses on nursing students
- NCLEX Pass Rates
 - 100% for the past few academic years, continue to meet benchmark of 90% or higher
- Graduate Employment
 - Survey timing has been updated.
 Previously at 6 months, updated to 12 months
- Graduates Pursuing a BSN or higher
 - O Updated benchmark due to consistently exceeding previous benchmark
- End of Program Student Learning Outcomes
- BRN Approval Visit preliminary report shows no areas of non-compliance, recommendation to keep close eye on attrition and get retention to above 75%

Goals:

-Reverse admission reduction, return to 40-44 admissions -Maintain retention of 70% or higher, strive for greater than 75% -Maintain NCLEX pass rates -Maintain grad employment rates -Continue to collaborate with

health care partners and universities

- Graduation Statistics
 - o May 2022 36
 - Decline over the past years due to decreased enrollment
- NCLEX Pass Rates
 - Consistently over 93% for the past 4 plus years
 - AP to LVN track remains at 100%, higher than state and national average
- Graduate Employment
 - o 97% for last 2 semesters
 - o Exceeding benchmark of 75%
 - o 89% employed at acute care hospitals
 - 11% employed at other health (outpatient surgery, imaging center, public health, correctional, school district, drug and alcohol rehab)
 - Small percentages employed at long term care, community, clinics
- Graduates Pursuing Advanced Degree
 - O Typically BSN, consistent at 50% within 1 year post graduation
 - Several in ADN to MSN
- Ethnicity
 - Reflects Ventura County and Ventura College
 - Hispanic 28%
 - Caucasian 19%
 - Filipino 8%
 - Mixed and African American 2%
- Retention Rate
 - Improvement
 - o Generic program 93% for 2020 and 2021
 - Spring 2022 increased attrition due to personal issues
 - $\circ \quad AP \ to \ LVN-good \ rates$
 - o 30-unit option typically do not fare well, yet two years in a row all passed
- End of Program Student Learning Outcomes
 - o Provide safe patient centered care
 - Communication
 - o Leadership and Management
 - Legal and Ethical
 - ATI Pulse Dashboard to show probability of students passing NCLEX, faculty is able to review weaker areas with students based on data
- Critical Thinking
 - Previously using exam from ATI, updated to use Comprehensive

Goals:

- -Maintain NCLEX pass rate greater than 90%
- -Maintain retention rate greater than 90%
- -currently using retention rate for 6 semesters, will be switching to completion on time -Continue to have accessible programs with BSN partners -Review Curriculum
- placement -Strengthen faculty orientation, pediatric clinicals is an issue

- BRN Approval Visit
 - o December 2021
 - Full continuing 5-year approval with no areas of non-compliance and no areas of recommendation
- Enrollment
 - o Decreased by 50% since 2018
 - o 2018-2020 due to inability to employ enough faculty
 - 2020 due to COVID and struggle with clinical placements

- RN Graduates Hired between August 2020 December 2021
 - o Moorpark none
 - o CSUCI 1
 - Ventura 2
 - o CSUCI Goleta 23
- Strengths and Opportunities
 - Students able to work at vaccine clinics and as nurse extender, allowed facility to get to know the student and make a smoother transition to hiring
 - o Graduates better prepared than in the past
 - Graduates more engaged than in the past
 - Professionalism concern regarding dialogue
 - Recommendation for back to back clinical shifts
 - Communication challenges between students and primary nurse regarding what students are able to do and what they are not
- 2022 Projections
 - o Entry level nurse residency
 - 12 graduates in Winter, 25 in Spring, 30 anticipated for Fall
 - Acute care transition to practice
 - 15 anticipated for Summer
 - Advanced practice fellowship
 - 2-3 anticipated for Fall
- Updates
 - Urgent care centers trying to ensure clinical opportunities and trying to determine how many to accept
 - Working on structuring the fellowship program

 - Students should understand that they are entering a service agency, customer service and communication are very important
- Objective: State initiatives and strategies implemented in response to accreditation and quality
 - 2021-2022 implemented sepsis screening, stroke scale, workplace violence training, Columbia suicide severity rating scale, nurse driven protocols
 - Education and compliance takes time
 - Time management is essential for students and nurses
- Objective: Discuss employment opportunities for new graduate nurses in Ventura County
 - Nurse residency program to start in September
 - o Critical care program
 - Perioperative program
 - Maternal child health







• Residency Program

- 2021-2022 12 from Ventura, 2 from Moorpark, 11 from CSUCI, 3 from other areas = total of 27 new grads
- o September 2022 12 openings
- 73 nurses have graduated since the start of the program in 2017, 12 have left organization maybe due to being located near a military institution
- o 84% retention rate
- Have put Acute Care and Emergency Department together to help with continuum of care

BRN New Process-

 Transcripts with degrees posted are no longer required, program directors now verify student graduation with BRN, graduates are able to initiate a test date within 24 hours, decreases back log

Group Discussion:

- Question #1: Initiatives and strategies that the school should be aware of in curriculum to meet employer needs
 - This was sufficiently covered within the presentations
- Needs for new grads in the areas of competency with communication, safety, patient care, and legal and ethical as well as desired competencies when hiring
 - VCMC Students lacking critical thinking and patient care due to COVID effects. When practicing mock codes staff on med surg froze and students stepped up. Really impressed with student output from colleges.
 - Cottage Hospital Students are not speaking appropriately in front of patients. Some examples are speaking negatively to primary nurse or instructor and immature behavior. Employee relations representative now comes to speak to new graduates due to issues.
 - Discussion on addressing nursing staff influence
 - Online environment led to lack of face to face interaction during classroom and lab time
 - Would be helpful for facilities to share what is expected regarding professionalism so that colleges can relay the information to students early on
 - o CMH Crucial conversations program could be very helpful
 - Cottage has onboarding presentation to identify expected behaviors
- Legal and ethical, patient safety medication administration is an important topic, use current events to have classroom discussions
- Ventura College How can we provide students insight on expectations
 - Scrubs or professional attire to interviews – make sure scrubs are clean and not wrinkled, lean towards professional attire
- Ventura College How to better prepare students for scenario questions during interviews
 - o CMH
 - perfume and cologne are not appropriate at hospitals
 - Interviewees have spoken poorly of colleagues in order to







Closing:	bolster themselves which shows lack of being a team player Focus on clinical scenario questions such as delegation and how to prioritize and coordinate with team Bathroom is a priority to avoid accidents or falls Cottage Health – Suggestions for before interviewing Stress the importance of cover letters to students as they help to differentiate resumes that otherwise are very similar Highlight additional languages spoken Discuss how experiences will relate to patient population Send PowerPoints to Ventura College's Administrative Assistant to forward to attendees Cynthia to post link to SurveyMonkey for evaluations and to provide CEUs Introduction of those that entered the meeting late
