The campus revised the equity plan to be a more inclusive and thoughtful process and submitted the plan in May 2020. AB705 should be viewed as a campus-wide initiative – not just Math and English Math department felt challenged with embedding equity into its pedagogy. Develop clear messaging so incoming and current students understand AB705, since Math and English placement tests are no longer required. Develop a stronger presence on the website so students are clear about English and Math pathways, possibly using video and bilingual materials.
