
As the semester kicks-off, there are some important items to note:

The Diversity in Culture Task Force meets the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month at 2:30 p.m. in MCE 226.



### **Governor's Proposed Budget FY20**

On January 10, Governor Newsom released his proposal for the 2019-20 State Budget which recognizes an ongoing strong economy, continued support of public education, and the need to prepare for the next economic downturn by increasing the States' Rainy Day Fund.

Each year, Proposition 98 establishes the minimum funding level for K-12 and community colleges. This funding source, through general apportionment, is what supports the day-to-day operations of our college. FY20 Proposition 98 revenues are projected to grow albeit at a slower pace than in the past several years.

#### **MAIN PROPOSED ITEMS:**

- Continue Student Centered Funding Formula at current percentages
- \$40M to expand California College Promise program to a second year
- \$10M to provide legal services to undocumented and immigrant students, faculty and staff
- \$248.3M for 3.46% COLA (Cost-Of-Living Adjustment)
- \$3B in non-Proposition 98 funds to buy down CalSTRS employer contribution rates in FY20 and beyond.

Base Allocation tied to FTES and college size (70%)

Supplemental Allocation targets equity of access and opportunity for low-income students (20%)

+

Student Success Allocation targets successful student outcomes (10%)

#### **IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER:**

- This is the beginning of the budget process. The proposals will be considered by legislative committees.
- Eventually, the Governor will release his Revised May Budget and the Legislature will pass the 2019-20 budget in June.
- We will provide you with updates throughout this process.
