Healthy Return to Campus

Over the summer, the college has been tirelessly working to prepare for a safe return. HVAC systems have been improved upon, buildings/offices have been cleaned, plexiglass partitions have been put in place, protective equipment and supplies have been ordered, additional screening sites opened, and much more. I want to thank the Pirate Crew members who have helped make this happen, especially, Facilities Maintenance and Operations, Student Health Center staff, and Sue Royer. <u>View this video</u> related to returning safely to campus.

Also, our I.T. crew has worked on campus during the entire pandemic to ensure technology resources for our students and employees are available and functioning properly. Many of our on-campus computers have not been touched in over a year. This required the I.T. crew to update each computer on campus. On August 10, the VCCCD Board of Trustees voted to mandate vaccinations for all employees and students (Board Policy 3506). Essentially, by October 15, all employees will be required to have verified vaccinations completed or an exception approved from Human Resources. Any individual accessing on-site and in-person instruction and services will also have the same vaccination requirements. I realize many of you may have mixed feelings related to the vaccine mandate. We know that the vaccines are not a panacea due to evidence of breakthrough cases, but vaccinations are proven to reduce COVID symptoms, hospitalizations, and deaths. In my opinion, the mandate is a step in the right direction to keep all of us healthy and safe.



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COVID-19 Health Screening

All Ventura College employees, students, and visitors are required to undergo a COVID-19 screening process before entering any campus facility. Masks must be worn at all screening locations. (CalOSHA Standards 3205, (c)(2)(B))

Ventura College Screening Locations and Hours*:

East Parking Lot (Drive-thru)

• Hours as of 8/16/21: M-Th 6 a.m. - 7:30 p.m., F 6 a.m. - 1 p.m.

Applied Science Center (in front, walk-up)

• Hours as of 8/16/21: M-F 6 a.m. - Noon

Athletic Event Center (in front, walk-up)

• Hours as of 8/16/21: M-F 6 a.m. - Noon

*Hours are subject to change.

You will need to complete the following steps before coming to campus:

- Step 1: Download the MyVCCCD mobile app on your smartphone.
 - If you don't have a smartphone, you can complete the Home Health Screening Online.
 - If you don't have an internet device, you can complete the pre-screening selfassessment on-site: Ventura College Home Health Screening
- **Step 2**: You may upload a picture of your vaccination card under "Report Vaccinations". This is an option to verify your vaccination status.
- Step 3: Please take the daily At Home Pre-Screening Survey before arriving on campus.
 - You may get a reminder daily to complete the screening, but you only have to perform the screening if you are coming to campus.
- Step 4: You will now receive a Health Pass. To find the pass, go to the profile section, click on "Health & Wellness", and then "My Health Pass".
- **Step 5:** Be sure to use your app to scan the QR code posted at every building in which you enter. This will assist with contact tracing if necessary.

If you are **RED**, please stay at home, contact your supervisor and the Student Health Center.

If you are **BLUE** or **GREEN**, you are cleared to come to campus to complete the screening process and receive a wristband indicating that you have been screened.

Ventura College is offering financial support for students

Ventura College has some amazing financial opportunities in store for students as they navigate their educational journey here at Ventura College. Here are the details:

- \$1,000 for all students affected by COVID with 6+ units enrolled for Fall. Awards will be • issued based on a demonstrated need.
- Welcome back to the 805 with \$805! Students that have not attended since 2020 and re-• enroll in 6+ units for the Fall semester will be welcomed back to Ventura College with \$805. This award will be prioritized by need, while funding lasts.
- 42% of Fall Classes are ZTC (Zero-Textbook-Cost).
- Students who wish to enroll in a payment plan through the Student Business Office will not need to pay the \$15 payment plan fee.
- Students do not need a parking permit for Fall 2021. Students can receive a \$100 Bookstore Voucher to use for anything sold in-store by verifying their vaccination status on the myVCCCD app. Students must have already been verified by Student Health Center which means they have received a "blue" pass in the app. Medically exempt students may receive verification from the Student Health Center to present to the bookstore to receive this voucher. Students may receive the voucher in the Bookstore now through September 2 and redeem it through September 30.

The Veterans Administration New Veterans Rapid Retraining Assistance Program (VRRAP) is Now Offered at Ventura College!

Veterans experiencing unemployment due to the COVID pandemic are among some of the hardest-hit populations in our country. The national jobless rate for all veterans increased to 6.5 percent in 2020 and to 7.3 percent for veterans who served in the Gulf War era according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

As part of the American Rescue Plan of 2021, a \$1.9 trillion economic stimulus package designed to help individuals and businesses recover from the effects of the pandemic, VRRAP was enacted by the VA in March 2021. The goal of VRRAP is to fund quick education and training certificate programs for high-demand jobs for veterans who are unemployed because of COVID.

Specifically, veterans who are between the ages of 22 and 66, who are unemployed due to COVID, are not significantly impacted by disability and have no other VA benefits remaining, may qualify for up to 12 months of paid tuition and fees which also includes a monthly housing allowance.

Ventura College is a VRRAP-approved institution of higher learning who is championing this unique opportunity in Ventura County. "The Ventura College Veterans Resource Center (VRC) is excited to offer 23 certificates of achievement programs that include some of our most popular programs like Automotive Technician, Accounting, Construction Management and the new Veterinary Assistant program," commented Jordana Ybarra-Telias, VRC Program Coordinator.

VRRAP is a rapid training program designed to be completed within 12 months and lead to immediate, gainful employment. "We carefully selected programs we felt could be completed within the tight 12-month timeline and that directly related to high-demand jobs as determined by the Department of Labor," Ybarra-Telias added.

VRRAP is unique because it provides new funding for veterans who have no remaining VA benefits to use for education. "As the VRC Coordinator, it breaks my heart when a veteran comes into our VRC and tells me her GI Bill expired before she was able to use it. Or the father who transferred all his GI Bill benefits to his children, but wasn't able to afford to attend college himself. VRRAP may be able to help those veterans to quick employability."

Under the VRRAP program, the VA pays approved colleges directly for a participating student's tuition and fees on a milestone basis. The college receives VRRAP funding when the student enrolls, when they complete the program and when they secure gainful employment.

"Similar to most VA programs, there are specific eligibility requirements and rules to follow. Our job at the VRC is to explain everything to the student, help them navigate college every step of the way–from their VRRAP application to VRRAP graduation."

"VC offers several VA programs as well as other educational funding resources from Federal, State and local entities." Jordana added. "The VRRAP doesn't cover the cost of textbooks, however, VC has a zero-textbook-cost program and other resources to help with educational expenses. "

At the VRC, we work closely with our students to make sure they access all the resources and benefits they are entitled to. The VRC supports all military-related persons seeking higher education and a good job.

All animal use will be compliant with the Animal Welfare Act with oversight of Ventura College's Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC). The classes are taught at East Campus, Monday through Thursday and pets would need to be dropped off and picked up at that location.
