Together, we have sailed (speed boat style) halfway through the semester, with roughly 40 instructional days remaining. Before you know it, the holidays and final exams will be upon us. **Thank you** again for your tireless work to support excellence in education at Ventura College as we continue to conduct most of our classes and services online.

To help keep our Pirate Ship on course, Ventura College engaged local therapists Robert Scholz and Victor Flores to provide **Mental Health Workshops** for all employees to access. The focus of the sessions is to assist employees with coping strategies related to the effects of the pandemic and their transition back to campus. The sessions will be held on Wednesday, October 20 and Thursday, October 21 in ASC 150 or 700m:

- Wednesday, October 20 at 2:30 p.m. to 4 p.m. for Instructional Faculty
- Tuesday, October 21 at 10 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. for Classified Professionals
- Tuesday, October 21 at 1 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. for Non-Instructional Faculty
- Tuesday, October 21 at 3 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. for Managers/Supervisors

For me, I have found a renewed energy around exciting happenings on campus that are not associated with the pandemic, including:

- The Gene Haas, Advanced Manufacturing Lab had its grand opening on Thursday, October 7 at the Applied Science Center at Ventura College. Representatives from the Gene Haas Foundation, Ventura College, VCCCD leadership and Board of Trustees, and the Ventura College Foundation attended. Students from Ventura Unified School District high schools also attended as part of a campus tour. In December 2019, the Gene Haas Foundation made a \$250,000 grant to the Ventura College Foundation to support the Advanced Manufacturing program at Ventura College. The funds were used to relocate the current manufacturing lab to the college's Applied Science Center and to renovate the new location into a modern manufacturing facility designed to promote manufacturing occupations and enhance student workforce manufacturing skills.
- Ventura College was awarded a \$5MIL, 5-year, HSI-STEM grant entitled: "Servingness: Aspiration, Identity, and Learning (S: AlL) in STEM. "Through this Title III Project, VC will embrace its identity as a Hispanic-Serving Institution by fostering an institution-wide commitment to providing a high quality, equity-minded learning environment in three domains: 1) Aspiration, 2) Identity, and 3) Learning. Ventura College faculty & staff will become stewards of VC's commitment to being a Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI). Students will be encouraged to complete STEM degrees and transfer.

Progress will be measured by increased access and participation in STEM degrees/careers among marginalized students, more equitable degree and career outcomes for Hispanic and low-income students in STEM, and increased transfer to CSU/UC STEM programs.

- Ventura College continues to make progress on our SIDE (Social Justice, Inclusion, Diversity, and Equity) work.
- A total of 22 classified professionals, faculty, and administrators completed an initial two-hour workshop on Friday as part of the USC Equity Institute. The discussion involved understanding personal social identities and mapping privilege, minoritization, and access to power. The USC Institute work will continue weekly over the next several weeks.
- Ventura College has a multitude of SIDE efforts
 occurring on our campus to identify, mitigate, and
 eliminate systemic processes that propagate inequity.
 RSS Consulting will be working with our Student
 Success Committee, Guided Pathway Committee, and
 Professional Development Coordination Council to
 develop recommendations for reducing overlap and
 duplication and strengthen integration and focus of
 our SIDE efforts. Additionally, RSS Consulting will
 support executive leadership in establishing a
 President's advisory group to provide advice and
 stewardship related to SIDE work.
- VC Equity Summit and Guided Pathways Retreats, featuring <u>Dr. Diego Navarro</u>, are available on October 15 and 22. Dr. Navarro is experienced with assisting colleges to meet the educational needs of disproportionately impacted students using datainformed solutions.
- VC Latinx Heritage Month celebrations were held virtually every Wednesday at noon beginning September 29 through October 13 honoring their culture, traditions, education, history, and art.
- UndocuAlly Week of Action activities are being held during the week of October 18-22. Information can be found here.

Lastly, I want to encourage you to attend the virtual Tuesday, October 19 Captain's Chat with updates on the Ventura College Mission statement revisions and the Facilities Master Plan draft that is near completion.


Mental Health Workshops

COVID-19 Vaccine Requirement Update



An update for the COVD-19 protocol was shared with students.

Students who are not fully vaccinated by October 15 and are accessing in-person, on-campus classes, were informed that they can continue with Fall classes by undergoing twice-weekly COVID-19 tests. Testing will occur on campus. If negative test results, students can proceed to attend a class or an event. Students do not need to be retested at each college.


MCE Mural - The Human Journey







Talented muralist Lisa Kelly has worked with Cari Lange and Gigi Fiumerodo to bring anthropology to life in the halls of the MCE building. Anthropology is the study of humans and the mural showcases the diversity and scope of this dynamic field of study. The focus of the mural is on biological and cultural anthropology. The left half of the mural depicts the major areas in Biological Anthropology: the biological basis of life and evolutionary theory, primatology, and the pattern of human evolution. The depictions of prehistoric humans transition to images of modern people from all over the globe. Indigenous and cultural representations from all continents are vibrantly displayed and illustrate themes in Cultural Anthropology. Local, indigenous Chumash culture is recognized with various rock art symbols and motifs.

How to Participate - Your Program or Department Must have Six Things to Participate:

- 1. A designated lead for your program's campaign that will work with the VC Foundation
- 2. An established Trust & Agency Account number. We need a place to forward your raised funds. Be sure to confirm this number with your supervisor.
- 3. A compelling, tangible cause (think Go Fund Me) and a fundraising goal. Think:
 - 1. What would make someone want to donate and support your program's cause?
 - 2. What is realistic to raise? The VC Foundation can help you determine your goal.
- 4. Permission from your DIVISION DEAN or VC VICE-PRESIDENT
- 5. A group of people who are ready to promote your Pirate's Provide project using social media, email, texting, phone calls, for the different 24 hours of giving
- Submit your <u>VC Pirates Provide Application</u> to the Ventura College Foundation by Friday, November 5, 2021
