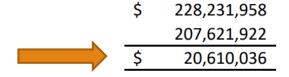

Current Status

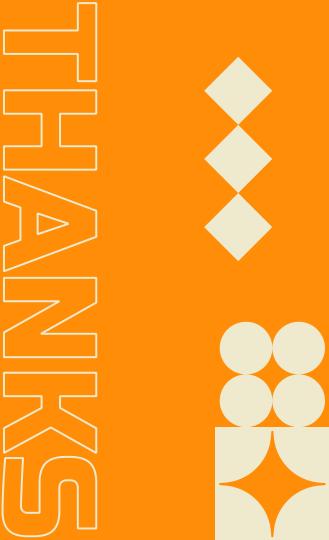
- ► Ventura County Board of Supervisors approved VC application for \$3 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in October 2022
- Geotechnical survey completed
- ► California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) compliance report completed
- ▶ Gafcon Inc selected as Project/Construction Management firm and approved at April 2023 Board meeting
- VC Facilities Oversight Group will be liaison between the campus community and the project/construction management and architect firms



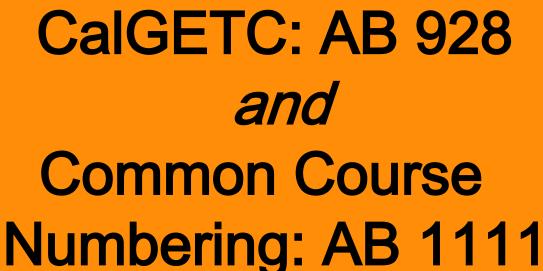
Timeline

AB 928 and AB 1111

- AB 928 = CalGETC, AB 1111 = Common Course Numbering
- As many unknowns as knowns
- Knowing what is evolving allows us to begin to plan.
- Affect transfer and articulation of Transfer
 Model Curricula courses & programs (C-ID)
 local courses and degrees TBD.





CalGETC: AB 928



GOALS of CalGETC:

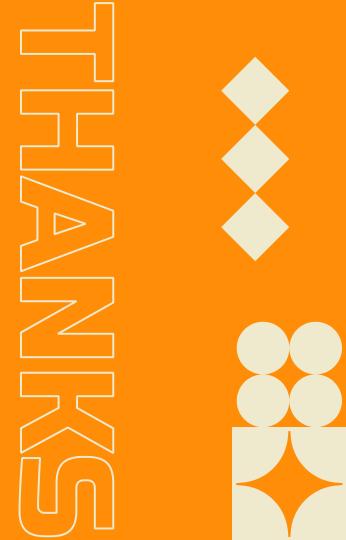
- Simplify transfer for students
 - UC and CSU align: common general education transfer requirements
- . Reduce overall units for students
 - 34 GE units = GOAL
- . Implement July 1, 2025

CalGETC Impact:

- Oral Communications included (+UC)
- Ethnic Studies included (+UC)
- Arts & Humanities reduced to 6 units (-UC and -CSU)
- Social and Behavioral Sciences reduced to 6 units (-UC)
- World Languages removed as transfer rqmt. (-UC)
 - Remains UC graduation requirement
- Lifelong Learning / Self-Development removed as transfer requirement (-CSU)
 - Upper- or lower-division grad. requirement = ?

Common Course Numbering: AB 1111



Common Course Numbering Goal:

- Simplify college access and completion for students
 - Same course numbers and prefix across state
 - Same course unit count among courses
 - Common articulation
- . Adopt July 1, 2024
- . Implement TBD

AB 1111 Impact:

All transfer model curriculum / C.I.D. courses will: Have the same course number and prefix.

- Decided by faculty
- Discussions leaning toward 4-digit numbers

Have the same unit count

- Decided by faculty
- Embedded lab time with lecture? Possibly.

Commonly articulate across the CCC, UC, and CSU system

- No need for individual course articulation agreements.
- No ability to change if and where courses land on GE areas.
