Library Canvas Modules

In 2018, your librarians participated in the Project ALAS (Aligning Learning and Academic Success) Grant through CSU Channel Islands. This brought us together with librarians from CSU Channel Islands, Moorpark College, and Oxnard College to collaborate on ways to improve student success. One outcome from that project was the idea of creating library and information literacy focused modules for Canvas that we could share and customize, then embed into our respective campus courses. Due to the LSP Project, we had a delay in beginning this new project; however, we are excited to announce that we have begun the first phase of integrating library modules into Canvas courses for English, Communication Studies, and Geology.

The modules are based on a design developed by librarians at CSU Channel Islands. We customized the content to support the course assignment(s) and based on feedback from the instructor. Below are examples of the piloted modules which can be found in the Canvas Commons (you may need to
