Textbook Lending Library

The Textbook Lending Library is a valuable resource to Ventura College students, as it allows them to check out textbooks for free for the entire semester. In these unusual times, we are exploring ways to continue to provide students access to this resource in the spring semester in a safe and equitable manner.

The Textbook Lending Library collection has historically been built from student donations of used textbooks. As a result, the collection has not included textbooks from every course, as our Reserves collection does. In order to provide students with a greater selection of textbooks in the spring semester, we are asking faculty to consider a few textbook options:

- Early Adoption
 Adopt your textbook(s) early so they appear in the Bookstore's website. We use the
 Bookstore's website to determine which textbooks are being used each semester. If a
 course does not show a textbook selection or shows an inaccurate textbook selection, we
 are unable to make a textbook available or may place the wrong textbook in the Lending
 Library for that course.
- Departmental Adoptions
 If possible, select textbooks as a department.
 If we know a department is using the same textbook across multiple course sections, we may be able to acquire more copies of that textbook to support those courses.
- Consider using an eBook or compilation of online library resources rather than a print textbook. We have several options for acquiring electronic books and we have many new databases and streaming services that may contain content that can be used as an alternative to a traditional textbook.
