Supporting Students with Free Textbooks and Equipment

Over the summer and into the start of the fall semester, library staff added 1,665 books to the ZTC and Textbook Lending Libraries for the Ventura Campus and East Campus. These collections include all print textbooks and novels that are required for ZTC courses such as ENGL V01A, COMM V01, and MATH V44. Additionally, library staff worked to get equipment returned or renewed in order to be fully stocked for the start of the semester.

In weeks one and two, students checked out 1,788 books from the ZTC and Textbook Lending Library items, 321 books from the VCEC ZTC and Textbook Lending Library, and 454 pieces of equipment.

The library is now out of stock on all Chromebooks and hotspots, but still has calculators available for students enrolled in Math courses. We are still in the process of receiving many textbooks and readers for ZTC courses and are making them available to students as quickly as we can!


