What is an FSA ID?

The FSA ID is a username and password that is used to electronically complete the FAFSA

*The CA Dream Act Application does not require an FSA ID

Parents

Parents of dependent students will need their own FSA ID to complete their student's FAFSA electronically

- Each FSA ID must have a unique e-mail address and phone number
- If parents are married, only one parent needs an FSA ID
- Parents may use the same FSA ID if one was created for another child in college

Parents without SSN

All individuals – regardless of their citizenship status – must have an StudentAid.gov account to access and sign the FAFSA form

- Parents must complete all steps to create an account, including answering 1-4 knowledge-based verification questions via TransUnion®
- If the TransUnion® process fails, parents must contact the Federal Student Aid Information Center (FSAIC) at 1-800-433-3243

¿Qué es una credencial FSA ID?

La credencial FSA ID es un nombre de usuario y contraseña que se utiliza para completar la FAFSA *El Acta del Sueño de California no requiere una credencial FSA ID

Padres

Los padres de estudiantes dependientes necesitarán su propia credencial FSA ID para completar la FAFSA de su estudiante electrónicamente.

- Cada credencial FSA ID debe tener un correo electrónico y un número de teléfono único
- Si los padres están casados, solo uno de los padres necesita una credencial FSA ID
- Los padres pueden usar la misma credencial FSA ID si se creó una para otro hijo en la universidad o colegio

Padres sin SSN

Todas las personas, independientemente de su estado de ciudadanía, deben tener una cuenta StudentAid.gov para acceder y firmar el formulario FAFSA.

- Los padres deben completar todos los pasos para crear una cuenta, incluida la respuesta de 1 a 4 preguntas de verificación basadas en conocimientos a través de TransUnion®
- Si el proceso TransUnion® falla, los padres deben comunicarse con el Centro de Información de Ayuda Federal para Estudiantes (FSAIC) al 1-800-433-3243
